On July 7 last a letter was addressed to you by this office, calling for certain information as to the sufficiency of the sureties on your official bond of July 19, 1897. On August 4 your clerk acknowledged the receipt of said letter and stated that as soon as you returned from your annual visit to the North a new bond would be executed. This office was informed by the Auditor for the State and other departments, under date of August 16, 1900, that in a recent letter to that office you asked to be furnished with the necessary blanks for a new bond as a Special Disbursing Agent of this Department.





Dear Sir

I have to inform you that Josiah Guthrie, Native policeman at this place resigned his post at the end of December, and we cannot find a suitable man willing to take his place. Indeed the Native here, or rather such as would fill the Office of policeman efficiently, are not-willing now to bind themselves to remain at home, the year round, for the small pay they receive.

My original plan I believe is the only workable plan, for our people, to fill such duties. That plan was, I had a corp of twenty men - who alternated with each other, two being on duty for a week or two when they were relieved by other two - but the whole corp, or as many as were at home, were available for duty in an emergency.

This plan worked admirably for many years while we were in British Columbia. Only the men on duty received an allowance for their services and the amount was allowed <sup>by Government</sup> for the two policemen would amply serve for such a corp.





AGENTS AND BONDED SUPERINTENDENTS :

I have been considerably annoyed lately by the carelessness with which correspondence addressed this office has been briefed and forwarded.

You are directed to see that the following regulations regarding correspondence are strictly served. This circular should be placed in a conspicuous place for ready reference.

### OFFICIAL CORRESPONDENCE.

All communications to the Department should be addressed to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Communications will be folded in three equal folds, parallel with lines of writing, indorsement to be placed upon first fold of the *last* sheet of the communication, leaving blank space of one and one-half inches at the top for Bureau stamp and "file mark," and at least two and one-half inches at bottom.

The indorsement should state: First, the official name of agency, its location, and date of the communication; second, name of writer and designation of his official position; third, brief, or indorsement, which should be short, yet sufficiently explicit to convey a clear idea of the contents of the communication. Loose sheets or jackets for this indorsement must not be used.

White paper, letter size, should be used in official communications.

All inclosures to communications, except regular quarterly returns, must be briefed and numbered in the order in which they are to be read, and their number stated at bottom of indorsement. The various pages of a letter are not, however, to be considered as inclosures.

Only black ink should be used—pale ink of any kind is prohibited.

Special care should be used in taking press copies of letters to avoid blurring and indistinctness.

Replies to communications from this office must refer to their date and initials and numbers found in upper left-hand corner of the same.

But one subject will be embraced or referred to in any one communication; when several are forwarded in any one mail they may be enclosed in one envelope. Telegraphic communications may embrace more than one subject.

The acknowledgment of the receipt of office letters, when the subject-matter does not call for reply, is unnecessary.

One side of the paper only should be written on. All instructions conflicting with the rules contained herein are hereby rescinded.

Agents are directed to promptly acknowledge the receipt hereof.

Attention is called to sample form of brief on first fold of this circular.



Disbursing officers, disbursing clerks, and disbursing agents of the Department of the Interior, and special agents employed by the Secretary of the Interior charged with the disbursement of public moneys, are instructed to observe strictly the following regulations in making explanations to statements of differences made in the examination and settlement of their accounts in the Treasury Department:

**DISALLOWANCES.**

Explanations to items *disallowed* by the Auditor on examination and settlement of an account can be considered only by the Comptroller of the Treasury on revision of the account. Requests for revision of accounts should be made directly to the Comptroller of the Treasury, and in all cases within one year from the date of settlement.

**SUSPENSIONS.**

1. All explanations of items *suspended* by the Auditor on examination and settlement of an account must be made directly to the *Auditor for the Interior Department*. (Treasury Department Circular 87, issued by the Comptroller of the Treasury and approved by the Secretary of the Treasury, April 25, 1895.)

2. Explanations should be made promptly. They should reach the Auditor, if possible, not later than *thirty days* from date of settlement.

3. Different accounts must be explained in separate communications, so that the explanations may be filed with the certificate of settlement in which final action is had.

4. Refer to accounts by period covered, and Auditor's certificate number. It will facilitate the handling of your explanation if you will begin it in the following manner:

Herewith are submitted explanations to items suspended in my account as \_\_\_\_\_ for the quarter ended \_\_\_\_\_, 190 , stated per Auditor's certificate No. \_\_\_\_\_.

Follow this with the explanation to each item separately and in regular order, referring to number number, and giving amount claimed under each item.

5. Explanations should answer fully and specifically all questions asked by the Auditor, and questions raised to the allowance of any item. All the items suspended in an account must be explained at the same time, so far as possible.

6. Items to which you desire to make no explanation should be indicated in your communication "conceded."

7. Where explanations are not received within a period of six months from date of settlement, and no satisfactory reason appears for the delay, it will be assumed that the disbursing officer has no sufficient explanation to make, and the item will be disallowed.


