THIS ACCOMPLISHED BY MEANS TELEGRAPHIC REPORTS FROM ALL LOCAL AND DISTRICT BOARDS AS TO NUMBER OF LICENSED PHYSICIANS IN EACH TOWN NOT ON BOARDS PERIOD. THE RESULTS INDICATE NO AVAILABLE PHYSICIANS FOR MEDICAL ADVISORY BOARDS IN ANY TOWN IN TERRITORY EXCEPT JUNEAU COMMA, DOUGLAS COMMA, KETCHIKAN COMMA, WRANGELL COMMA, SEWARD AND FAIRBANKS PERIOD. The Local Board shall enter in the first two columns marked "Totals in Class I", "Totals in Class II," "Totals in Class III," "Totals in Class IV and "Totals in Class V" the number of registrants who have been classified in each class, placing the number of white and colored registrants in each class in the proper columns.

7. It will then itemize the number of registrants, white and colored, in Class I, by placing the first two columns the number in each sub-division of Class I indicated on this form. The totals in Class I, as itemized, must exactly equal the totals appearing in the line marked "Total in Class I".

8. The Local Board will then list in the proper columns the number of men in each Class (and sub-divisions of Class I) who are carried on its Emergency Fleet Classification List. Such registrants will already have been included in the number of registrants appearing in the first two columns of this form, but should be again listed under the proper columns headed "Emergency Fleet List."
