

funds. The nation is at war. Personal sacrifices are being made on every hand. The soldiers who are being selected by local and district boards have given up comfortable homes, have severed home ties, in many cases have been delighted to sacrifice large incomes in order to work and fight for their country twenty-four hours a day for thirty dollars per month. Most of these men are willing to serve for even less or for nothing. They are now enduring or will hereafter endure suffering and hardships and in many cases be compelled to sacrifice their lives or health. Therefore it is not unreasonable to request the great army composed of local board members to meet the government and cooperate with it in the matter of minimum cost. This is their country, they are part of its army, and it is confidently expected that they will give the government in the future, as they have in the past, the best that is in them, and that they will receive compensation only to the extent that may be necessary in their condition of life. In computing a unit cost, this office has endeavored, after consultation with many board members and state officials, to fix upon a unit cost, the total of which will equal the compensation which would have been a proper charge under the regulations. Therefore a regulation has been approved by the President fixing the aggregate compensation to all the members of a local board upon the basis of thirty cents for each registrant finally classified. It will be observed that in absence of other distribution thereof among the members which may be determined upon by unanimous vote of a local board, the aggregate of the unit cost will be divided into equal portions between the members of a board. It will also be observed that the board may by unanimous vote change this proportionate distribution so that one or more members may receive more than his proportionate fraction while others may receive less. This provision is made not for the purpose of permitting boards of which some members are rendering gratuitous service to vote an amount which may have been received by them to the other member or members, but is intended to be applied by boards only in those cases which for one reason or another sometimes arise, where the greater portion of the work is necessarily performed by one or another of the members of the board. All Adjutants General are urgently requested immediately to give the widest publicity not only to the new regulations but to the reasons for its promulgation. The new regulation which is to take the place of Section 195 and is to be known as Section 195a, is as follows:

Section 195, S.S.R., is repealed and in lieu thereof the following is promulgated by the President.

"Section 195 Amended. Local Boards. Compensation. The rate of compensation for members of local boards up to and including the completion of the final classification of the registrant within the respective jurisdiction of said boards shall be on the basis of thirty cents, as aggregate compensation to the membership of a local board, for each registrant to whom a questionnaire shall have been mailed and who shall have been finally classified in accordance with the provisions of the regulations. Money due for said work shall be paid in proportionate amounts to each member of a local board claiming compensation for his services, unless it shall be requested by the unanimous vote of the local board that the moneys due should be paid in some other proportion. In such cases no one member shall receive more than fifteen cents of the allowance of thirty cents for each classification and no two members shall receive more than twenty-five cents for each classification to be distributed between them. There may be cases where all members of a local board desire compensation, but where certain members may have performed more work than others who may have been unable to give the necessary time. In such cases the local board may, by unanimous vote recorded on its minutes, make the proper division of its compensation. There will be other cases where members of local boards will do their share of the work and who desire to give their services to their government without charge. In such cases the amount to be paid to the members claiming compensation will be proportionate only unless otherwise shown by the minutes. The purpose of this provision is to protect the government for the value of gratuitous services thus rendered by members of local boards who do not claim compensation. Sixty per cent of said compensation shall be due and may be paid when sixty per cent (or more) of the registrants have been finally classified under Section 109 hereof; an additional twenty per cent may be paid when eighty per cent (or more) of registrants have been finally classified; an additional ten per cent when ninety per cent of registrants have been finally classified, and the final ten per cent may be paid when one hundred per cent have been finally classified. No payments shall be made by disbursing officers for the work performed by members of local boards except in compliance with this regulation; and no payments shall be made to any member of a local board at a greater rate than his proportionate amount of the thirty cents allowed to entire local board for each registrant, except upon receipt by the disbursing officer of a certified copy of the minutes of a local board as herein mentioned. Section 195 and all other regulations providing any compensation to members of local boards are hereby repealed.

"If any compensation based upon the provisions of Section 195 shall have been paid to any member of any local board before the promulgation of this regulation the same shall be considered to have been based upon the provisions of this regulation, and any and all further payments to such members shall be computed accordingly. This regulation is not intended to nor does it affect compensation of clerks or of examining physicians who are not members of boards or of allowances for other necessary expenses as provided in these regulations. In lieu of the certificate concerning service rendered by members of local boards to be made by their chief clerk of each local board as provided in Section 17 hereof, the chief clerk of each local board shall prepare the claims and vouchers for compensation of members of local boards under this regulation and shall enter thereon the following certificate:

"I hereby certify that the total number of registrants within the jurisdiction of this local board is blank and that blank of such registrants have been finally classified in accordance with the selective service regulations!

"In case of transferred cases, whether as to classification or physical examination or both, members of the local board of origin shall be entitled to the compensation herein provided!

"In submitting vouchers for pay of members of local boards, the terms of these instructions must be fully complied with, otherwise the disbursing officer will be compelled to refuse payment on the vouchers.

This office acknowledges receipt of your favor under date of the 7th inst., enclosing a copy of a permit issued by your Board, under date of January 7, 1918, to Arthur Newman Erickson, of Port Walter, Alaska, authorizing him to ship aboard Motorship Wergland, out of Portland, Oregon. This permit is irregular, and your Board should issue another to conform to the regulation.

This man is registered in the jurisdiction of Local Board No. 6, City of Sitka, Sitka Alaska; therefore, I assume that you acted under authority of Section 156 of the Selective Service Regulations. In fact, Mr. Erickson referred the matter to this office, by telegram, on December 29th, and, not being sure whether his case came under the provisions of Section 156 S.S.R., it was referred to the Provost Marshal General, who ruled that the procedure was covered by this Section. This office then wired the registrant to the effect that it had been so decided by the Provost Marshal General, and that he should apply to Local Board No. 6, Sitka Alaska, for a permit under the provisions of that Section. Hence the matter should have been referred to your Board with the recommendation of the Sitka Board; then your Board should have followed the procedure outlined in Section 156, by causing the registrant to file an application in conformity to Section 299 S.S.R. Thereupon your Board should have investigated the merits of the registrant's application, and, if found meritorious, issued the form of permit provided in Section 300 S.S.R. I respectfully suggest that, if you have not already made an investigation of the merits of the application, you do so at once and either refuse or issue the permit as prescribed by the regulation.

The form of the permit which you forwarded to this office, reads "By order of Captain Ziegans", who, I presume, is the Executive Officer of the Selective Draft at your state headquarters. I respectfully suggest that it is not within the

power of any officer at state headquarters to order or direct the issuance of a permit of this kind. This is a matter which is within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Local Board. And properly so, for the reason that the Board occupies to the registrant the relation of a quasi-judicial tribunal, whose duty it is to investigate the application for permit, pass upon the evidence and determine, thereon, the merit of the application. No officer at state headquarters is authorized to do this, and to ignore this provision of the regulation would render the issuance of permits of this kind subject to the whim or desire of officers at state headquarters to grant favors to registrants.

This registrant is a subject of Norway, although he has declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States, and, thereby, is subject to draft. According to his telegram, he desires to ship aboard a Norwegian vessel, which he says is chartered by this Government. It is a matter of common knowledge, in this locality, that the majority of this class of registrants are unfavorable to the Selective Draft. Therefore, it is believed, a careful investigation of this case should be made before the man is permitted to sail.

Copies of this letter, together with copies of your permit, are being forwarded to Capt. Ziegans and to the Provost Marshal General, with recommendations of this office.

While this method of procedure is somewhat irregular, I suggest that you stamp the designation of your Board in the space provided therefor in the upper left hand corner on the first page of the questionnaire, stamp the date in the space provided therefor just below the cut of a hand in the upper left hand corner, and, on the blank line, opposite the stamped date, sign the notice by one of the members of your Board, file it, make a notation on your list so you will understand that this man's questionnaire need not be mailed out, then consider and classify him in the classification in which, in your judgment, he should be placed.
