Any Alaskan registrant desiring voluntary induction may  
comma, until further orders comma, be inducted as follows colon:  
First period. All applicants should be sent to Fort McDowell  
California period. The papers accompanying him should show the

branch of service for which he is inducted comma, but owing to changeable conditions no guarantee can be given that he will secure service in the branch chosen period. Second period. Great care should be exercised to prevent abuse of this privilege for the purpose of securing free transportation to the states period. Third period. The present uncertainty as to the applicants being able to secure the branch of service chosen is due to shortage of supplies and housing facilities semicolon; but as soon as receiving depots are ready induction will be more regular and Alaskan registrants will have the same advantages as others period. Fourth period. In sending men inducted under the provisions of this telegram comma, local boards will prepare three copies of form one thousand twenty nine for each man or group semicolon; also prepare two copies of form one thousand ten for each man period. One copy each of form one thousand twenty nine and one thousand ten will be sent to the camp with the inducted man and one copy of each of these forms will immediately be mailed to the camp after the man has been forwarded colon: the third copy will be held by the local board in a separate file until further orders period. In using form one thousand twenty nine for voluntary induction as prescribed in this telegram comma, local boards will write across the face of the first page thereof comma, in bold red ink characters comma, the word quote voluntary unquote and the word quote infantry Quartermasters Corps comma, Medical Department unquote or whichever word designates the branch of service for which each man was inducted period. Where practicable comma, men should be sent in

groups even if it is necessary to delay some applicants as much as a week comma, but no delay for more than a week for any applicant is authorized period. Fifth period. Great care should be exercised in conducting physical examination comma, and no applicant should be sent unless it appears certain that he is physically qualified period. Sixth period. Transportation from local board to destination should be provided as prescribed by section one hundred seventy comma, and meal tickets as prescribed by section one hundred sixty one and supplemental instructions being mailed period. Seventh period. If possible comma, arrangements should be made with steamship company to furnish transportation comma, including ticket over connecting railway comma, where necessary comma, and tourist pullman accommodation comma, where the journey by rail requires more than twenty four hours period. In no case should standard pullman accommodation be furnished period. In case transportation cannot be furnished in this manner comma, ordinary transportation request should be used in securing transportation over connecting railways.

Subject: Supplemental Instructions in Regard to Transportation Requests and Meal Tickets.

The following supplemental instructions in regard to issuing transportation requests and meal tickets are promulgated to all concerned.

TRANSPORTATION REQUESTS. One request only should be made out for each party of men sent on any day.

If more than one man is sent, select one who is known or is thought to be most competent to take charge of the party. Fill out the request beyond the words, "To Any Common Carrier: Please furnish to", with the name of the man selected and the number of other men with him. For example, if you have ten men to send and you select John Doe as in charge of the party, the request would read "Please furnish to John Doe and nine (9) other men", etc.

Chairman of Local Boards or some other member of the board in their absence will sign the request on the dotted line under the name of the Quartermaster General.

The duplicate request should be made for tourist car accommodations on the basis of three men to each section. Army regulations, paragraph 1128, provides as follows: "Enlisted men . . . when traveling under orders without troops, when the journey exceeds twelve hours, and is scheduled to terminate after midnight, are entitled to a berth in a tourist sleeping car, upper if available, but, when the number is three or more, tourist car accommodations will be furnished on the basis of three men to a section. Standard sleeping car accommodations will not be furnished in any instance." These regulations will govern in the handling of drafted men into camp.

The transportation request reads: "Good only when signed and stamped with office seal!"

You are informed that your local board rubber stamp will be used as the "office seal" and placed in the space to the left of your signature.

MEAL TICKETS. When the meal tickets were prepared it was intended that each man should receive sufficient meal tickets to cover all meals from the time he reported until he reached camp. It was afterwards decided that this would involve too much work upon all concerned and that the meal tickets

could be altered so as to cover a party of men traveling together, hence the supplemental instructions which were sent with each book of meal tickets said that the word "one" could be stricken out and the number of meals furnished inserted. The same man who is selected to take charge of the transportation should be put in charge of the meal tickets also and the following instructions given him.

The change from "one" to the number of meals furnished should be made at the time that the meals are furnished as the exact number cannot be determined before hand and there might be instances where the party is so large that one restaurant or hotel could not accommodate all the men and it would be necessary to divide them between two or more places for the same meal in which case each ticket will have to be indorsed with the number furnished at each place.

The instructions on the back of the meal ticket state that the original is to be given to the person furnishing the meal, the duplicate sent to the Depot Quartermaster heretofore indicated and the triplicate retained by the Chairman of the Board. It will be observed that the duplicate is fastened into the book, while the original and triplicate are perforated, it is therefore suggested that the triplicate be sent to the Depot Quartermaster instead of the duplicate.

To carry this out under the new scheme, after providing for the men before entrainment give a sufficient number of meal tickets to the man in charge of the party to cover all possible contingencies, including that of having to divide up the party if it is large, also a memorandum of all the ticket numbers and a franked envelope addressed to yourself. Upon his reaching camp he will return the memorandum to you showing the number of meals furnished on each ticket together with all unused tickets. From this information it will be possible to complete the duplicate and triplicate copies, after which the triplicate should be sent to the Depot Quartermaster indicated. Be sure to indicate on the back of the meal ticket the location of the Quartermaster designated to pay it, as otherwise the persons furnishing the meals will not know where to mail them.

Meal tickets should be used for all meals for the men after they report, while waiting for entrainment, as well as while enroute.

Any Alaskan registrant desiring voluntary induction, may, until further orders, be inducted as follows; First. All applicants should be sent to Fort McDowell, California. The papers accompanying him should show the branch of service for which he is inducted, but owing to changeable conditions, no guarantee can be given that he will secure service in the branch chosen.

Second. Great care should be exercised to prevent abuse of this privilege for the purpose of securing free transportation to the states.

Third. The present uncertainty as to the applicants being able to secure the branch of service chosen is due to shortage of supplies and housing facilities; but as soon as receiving depots are ready, induction will be more regular and Alaskan registrants will have the same advantages as others.

Fourth. In sending men inducted under the provisions of this letter, local boards will prepare three copies of form 1029 for each man or group; also prepare two copies of form 1010 for each man. One copy each of form 1029 and 1010 will be sent to the camp with the inducted man and one copy of each of these forms will immediately be mailed to the camp after the man has been forwarded; the third copy will be held by the local board in a separate file until further orders. In using form 1029 for voluntary induction as prescribed in this letter, local boards will write across the face of the first page thereof, in bold red ink characters, the word "voluntary" and the word "Infantry Quartermasters Corps, Medical Department" or whichever word designates the branch of service for which each man was inducted. Where practicable, men should be sent in groups, even if it is necessary to delay some applicants as much as a week, but no delay for more than a week for any applicant is authorized.

Fifth. Great care should be exercised in conducting physical examination, and no applicant should be sent unless it appears certain that he is physically qualified.

Sixth. Transportation from local board to destination should be provided as prescribed by section 170 SSR, and meal tickets as prescribed by section 161 SSR, and supplemental instructions being mailed.

Seventh. If possible, arrangements should be made with steamship company to furnish transportation, including ticket over connecting railway, where necessary, and tourist pullman accommodation, where the journey by rail requires more than twenty-four hours. In no case should standard pullman accommodation be furnished. In case transportation cannot be furnished in this manner, ordinary transportation request should be used in securing transportation over connecting railways.
