First. Please advise each member of your board that the frequency with which board members have been leaving the towns in which boards are located, and have been going outside, without first notifying and securing permission from this office, is having a tendency to embarrass the administration of the Selective Service Law in the Territory.

Second. The period of classification and selection is now rapidly approaching, and it is important that all board members be on hand to classify the questionnaires as rapidly as possible after they shall have been sent to the registrants and returned. Therefore, board members will not leave their home towns for a greater period than one week, and will not leave the Territory at all, without first communicating with this office and receiving permit to do so.

Third. It is recognized that it may be necessary, in cases of urgent necessity, for board members to temporarily leave the Territory and in such cases permits will be granted, but not otherwise.

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 4th instant, addressed to Captain John T. Hunt, Disbursing Officer and Agent of the United States in Alaska, with respect to the account current for the month of December, 1917, Voucher #32; request being made that an authority for purchase of filing cabinet be submitted, with a "property voucher" covering same.

As the December account in question was made out by me as the predecessor to Captain Hunt, D. O. & A., he has handed the letter to me for attention.

I enclose herewith copy of telegram of November 5, 1917, received by the Governor from the secretary (or clerk-member) of Local Board No. 10, Anchorage, with respect to certain supplies needed by that Board, also copy of the Governor's telegraphic reply of November 5th, authorizing the Board to secure the necessary supplies. The Governor's authority to the local board was predicated upon authority received by him from you to permit boards to purchase necessary supplies. This telegraphic correspondence will, I believe, cover the matter of authority with respect to voucher #32, mentioned above.

With regard to the instruction to file a "property voucher" I beg to advise that I am unable at this time to comply, inasmuch as I have no form for such return, and can find no information relative thereto in any regulations at hand. This office is in receipt of your favor of the 6th instant, advising that, inasmuch as the regulations provide for compensation, your board will not gratuitously furnish its services to the Government. You may be interested to know that, to date, your board is the only one which has refused to donate its services to the Government. Of course, you have a right, under the regulations, to demand pay for your services, and if, in view of these facts, you still feel that you should receive compensation, it will be paid.

I have no desire to urge you to donate your services, except as a free will offering by the members of your board; but, I do wish to impress upon you that, as a matter of civic pride, it is the duty of all Alaskans connected with the administration of the Selective Service Law to practice the most rigid economy on behalf of the Government, as this is the only means whereby the unit cost of producing our quota for the army can be kept within reasonable bounds. When you understand that the total number of registrants in Alaska is only about 7000, which is less than the quota furnished by some of the larger cities of the United States, you will appreciate the fact that, at the best we can do, the expense of keeping the machinery of the Selective Draft in operation in Alaska will proportionately be larger than in the states; therefore, I sincerely hope you and the members of your board will take these facts into consideration, and, should you decide to reconsider your statement, fill out and return Forms 41 to this office.

Your attention is directed to Section 213 S.S.R., which provides, in part, as follows: "When compensation for services rendered by members of Local or District Boards, or by any other persons rendering services to such boards, is authorized at an hourly rate, an excerpt of minutes of the Local or District Board showing the dates of service and the number of hours of service each day must be entered on the face of the voucher, or by a certificate attached and noted on the face of voucher as a part thereof. Such note or certificate shall be authenticated by the signature of the chief clerk of the board." Inasmuch as the services for which this voucher is issued covered a period of approximately two and one half months, it is obvious that the work must have been done on an hourly basis. Therefore, this provision of the regulations will have to be complied with, in filling out the voucher, before it can be paid.

This may seem to you unnecessarily technical; but, when you realize that if I pay the voucher without it containing all of the data called for by the regulations, the check will be charged against my bond and will have to be paid out of my own pocket, you readily see that I am compelled to insist

Subject: The liability of Paul Albert Kinninook to registration at Dallas, Polk County, Oregon, his duty to fill out and file questionnaire, and the return of correspondence with reference thereto.

Referring to your favor of January 30, 1918, enclosing correspondence relative to the registration of Paul Albert Kinninook, and the filing of his questionnaire, I beg to advise that it is deemed best to have this registrant make out and file his questionnaire in the usual way; otherwise he would be subject to the penalties prescribed for failure to do so.

I think an erroneous impression exists with reference to the status of the Alaskan Indian. He is not absolutely exempt from registration, but the requirement for his registration was suspended during the registration period. However, he was not then subject to registration, nor has any ruling been made canceling this suspension. Therefore, it seems that there is but one course to pursue and that is to ask the Provost Marshal General to require his registration card, and all procedure with reference thereto to be transferred to Alaska, then, if that be done, cancel his registration.

It is not possible to do anything through the Oregon authorities, for the obvious reason that Indians were subject to registration in Oregon. He was in that state when registration took place there, and registered, therefore the Adjutant General of the State of Oregon no doubt will treat his case the same as he would treat the registration of any other Indian.

This office will take the matter up with the Provost Marshal General and ask for a ruling thereon. The questionnaire and correspondence pertaining to this case are herewith returned.

Subject: Instructions relative to interpretation and application of Sections 47, 99, 111, 170, 120 and 121, S.S.R., covering procedure for reopening, reclassifying and appealing cases on newly discovered evidence.

This office is in receipt of telegraphic instructions from the Provost Marshal General, as follows:

"1. Reports from states and character of papers accompanying appeals to President indicate lack of complete understanding concerning discretionary powers of boards to extend time limits, receive new evidence, reopen cases, and reclassify registrants.

"2. The Governor, Adjutant General or Government Appeals Agent may at any time before induction of a registrant into military service suggest to boards extension of time limits or reopening of case or reclassification of registrant on additional evidence or where boards have clearly misinterpreted or misapplied rules and regulations. Registrants or other interested persons may also file with local or district boards additional evidence or other proof in support of claim for deferred classification at any time before induction of registrant. Such suggestions of extension or reopening and such filing of additional proof are not binding upon boards who are to exercise wise discretion in all cases in order to do complete justice. No appeal lies from refusal of boards to extend time or reopen or reclassify.

"3. If such suggestions or additional affidavits or proof are filed in support of claim other than industrial or agricultural, the local board shall consider such suggestions or additional affidavits or proof as the case may be, and may, in its discretion, reopen the case, and upon the whole record, including the questionnaire and original proof, reconsider such case and reclassify the registrant.

"4. If such suggestions or additional affidavits or proof are filed in an industrial or agricultural claim, the local board shall in all cases consider such suggestions and additional affidavits or proof and forward the case, with its recommendation thereon, to the district board, transmitting the entire record including the questionnaire if the same be in the

possession of the local board. The district board shall thereupon consider such suggestions or additional affidavits or proof as the case may be and may, in its discretion, reopen the case, reconsider the claim and reclassify the registrant. If the questionnaire and original evidence are not in the possession of the local or district board but have gone forward to the President on appeal, the district board shall request of the Adjutant General of the state the return of the same. After considering the case, the district board should return the entire record to the local board with an indorsement indicating its action either in refusing to reopen the case or in reclassifying the registrant.

"5. If the local or district board, as the case may be, refuse to reopen a case, the case shall thereupon remain in all respects in the same condition as before the filing of the suggestion for reopening of additional affidavits or other proof; and if the case was on appeal to the President and had not been acted upon the complete record shall be returned to him.

"6. If the claim for deferred classification is reopened and the registrant is reclassified by either the local or district boards, as the case may be, the person making the claim shall be notified by the local board, as provided in the regulations, of the classification given after the reopening, and shall be entitled in all respects to the same rights as though the decision of the local or district board has been made on the first consideration of the claim or claims of or on behalf of the registrant, and the case shall proceed in accordance with the regulations as if it were one of original classification.

"7. Induction of the registrant into military service shall not be stayed by the district or local boards on account of the reopening of his case.

"8. Whenever an appeal to the President has been taken, and either before or after the case has been forwarded to the President, and before the President has acted on the appeal, if any evidence comes to the knowledge of the local board, or Government Appeals Agent or the Adjutant General of the state, which in the judgment of any of them is material to the proper classification of the registrant, such new evidence may be embodied in affidavits or in a statement signed by a member or members of the local board, or the Appeals Agent, or the Adjutant General, and may be filed as the basis for reopening the case by the local or district boards as the case may be. If the local

board reopens the case and reclassifies the registrant on a claim within the jurisdiction of the local board, it shall thereupon forward the entire record to the district board for review by the district board regardless of whether or not an appeal is noted either by or in behalf of the registrant or by the Government Appeals Agent; and, in all such cases the district board shall have the right to review and affirm, modify or reverse the reclassification by the local board. If the claim for deferred classification is on industrial or agricultural grounds within the original jurisdiction of the district board, the local board shall forward the entire record including the new evidence, to the district board, with its recommendation. In every such case the district board after considering the case shall return the record to the local board, with an indorsement of its action, as if it were an original claim.

"9. In cases which have been appealed to the President and have proceeded in accordance with the foregoing paragraph eight, if the district board adheres to its former decision granting less deferred classification than claimed by the registrant, the questionnaire and the entire record, after being returned to the local board, shall be forwarded by the local board to the President on appeals in the manner directed by the regulations, so that all evidence to be considered on appeal to the President shall have been considered previously by the local and district boards. The President in such cases will not consider any evidence, suggestions or considerations which were not considered by the local and district boards.

"10. Referring to Section 111, local or district boards may extend the time for filing claim of appeal to the President upon satisfactory showing that there has been no culpable delay on the part of the registrant or other interested person. Local and district boards have similar discretion to reopen and extend time limits in all proceedings in which such limits are fixed in the Selective Service Regulations, and Governors, Adjutants General and Government Appeals Agents may suggest to local and district boards the exercise of this discretion in meritorious cases."

Pointer, on the original Form 101 executed by this board, and later was given to Milan Delich; but, upon carefully examining the records of this office, it is found that this does not constitute a duplication for the following reason: The Form 101 dated October 30, 1917, contained the list of serial numbers assigned prior to the receipt of your telegram Number A-386, requiring all of the registration cards which showed, on their faces, home addresses in other States and Territories to be mailed to the Adjutants General of such States and Territories. When this order was complied with approximately 300 cards were mailed, by this board, to the Adjutants General of other States and Territories.
