Subject: Instructions relative to taking up Certificate of Final Classification to be taken up when Registrant is Inducted.

You are instructed that Selective Service Regulations, Form 999, have been amended by the addition of the following section :

"SECTION 162½. CERTIFICATE OF FINAL CLASSIFICATION TO BE TAKEN UP WHEN REGISTRANT IS INDUCTED. Upon the calling of the roll as provided in Section 163 a member of the Local Board shall immediately take up the certificate of final classification of each selected man, or obtain a complete explanation regarding the disposition that he has made of the same. In cases of voluntary or any form of special or individual induction, the same procedure will be followed at the time of the delivery of form 1029 A and B to the inducted man. This course is necessary, in order to prevent persons, who have not performed the duties imposed on them by the Selective Service Law, from obtaining possession of the certificates of men who have been inducted into the military service, and, by impersonating such men or changing the names on the certificates, evading military service. The certificate should be placed in the cover sheet of the Questionnaire. If the certificate is not surrendered the Local Board shall immediately report that fact and the man's explanation to the Adjutant General who shall immediately forward such report to the Provost Marshal General."

You are instructed that this office is in receipt of an amendment to Section 151, S. S. R., as follows:

"Please notify all local boards of the following amendments to section 151, S.S. R.:
A subparagraph is added to paragraph E as follows:
" Under such regulations as the quartermaster general may prescribe, students pursuing a course of agriculture, in the senior year, in land grant agricultural colleges whose claims standing places them in the upper third of the senior class as determined by the school authorities, may enlist in the enlisted reserve corps of the quartermasters department, and thereafter, upon presentation by the registrant to his local board of a certificate of such enlistment, such certificate shall be filed with the questionnaire and the registrant shall be placed in class five on the ground that he is in the military service of the United States."

After the words "enlisted reserve corps of the medical department" in line two of paragraph F add the words "enlisted reserve corps of the quartermasters department".

This is necessary to obtain an accurate checking up of all persons hitherto reported by the emergency fleet corporation."

Subject: Instructions relative to provisions of Sections 129 to 138, S.S.R., for the disposition of registrants who fail to comply with the Selective Service Law and Regulations.

You are instructed that this office is in receipt of a telegram from the Provost Marshal General relative to the proper application of the provisions of Sections 129 to 138, S.S.R., as follows:

3 " This office has learned of effective method provided by sections 129 to 138, S.S.R., for the disposition of registrants who fail to comply with the Selective Service Law and regulations is not being promptly followed, with the result that many registrants who failed to file questionnaires or to report for physical examination have not been placed in the status which would make possible their apprehension and appropriate disposition as deserters. The importance of issuing promptly forms 1013, 1014 and particularly 1018 P.M.G.O. appears not to have been fully recognized. Reports are being received that agents of the department of justice and police officials very frequently are unable to ascertain promptly of State headquarters or local boards the status of registrants, and that when replies are obtained, the delinquent in the majority of cases has not been inducted.

Many registrants have failed to submit questionnaire or report for physical examination. By this date practically all registrants who failed to submit questionnaires except in special cases where time has been extended, should have been reported to the Adjutant General of the army as deserters on form 1018 P M G O . No reward is payable for the apprehension of a delinquent and this case may be disposed of only by resort to the process of the courts involving delay and expense to the Government. A deserter however may be apprehended

" without warrant; a reward of fifty dollars is payable for each wilful deserter apprehended and delivered to the military authorities and the reward deducted from the pay of the deserter.

It is obvious that the most effective method of handling registrants who endeavor to shift their military obligations to others is for all concerned to proceed immediately to treat all such registrants as provided by sections 129 to 138 S.S.R., and to inaugurate a vigorous campaign to round up, apprehend and turn over to the military authorities all deserters. It is equally important that police officials be encouraged to devote their best efforts to the apprehension of delinquents and deserters by having their requests for information promptly and correctly answered."

You will, in all cases, please promptly carry out the provisions of these sections as indicated in this telegram.

*Information reached this office to the effect that some district boards are not making the fullest profitable use of section 36 and of rule 36 section 107, S.S.R., in composing differences of opinion as to classification between local and district boards and in securing from the local boards information necessary to make proper classification. District boards should feel free to consult with local boards, to return records for addition information, and to compose differences of classification by this method. In this way only can we hope to secure that uniformity of decision and action so essential to even exertion of the law.

You will please be guided by provisions of this telegram in your method of procedure, as it is believed that such a course will insure harmony of action and uniformity of decision.

You are instructed that this office is in receipt of telegram number B 100 from the Provost Marshal General, as follows:

"Section 51, S. S. R., as amended by changes number two, on January 25th, 1918, is hereby amended and made to read as follows:
'Upon the arrest of a deserter the police officials arresting him shall take him before a nearby local board (preferably the local board having jurisdiction of him) which local board shall immediately inquire whether his offense was wilful and committed with an intent to evade military service, and if it so finds shall make and deliver to such police officials a certificate to that effect and direct such police official to deliver the deserter to the nearest army camp, post or station. The form of this certificate (form 1021) will be found in part ten but no printed form will be furnished.
If the local board finds that the offense was not wilful and the registrant has been physically examined, the board shall forthwith send him to the nearest mobilization camp. If the registrant has not been physically examined the local board shall examine him physically, and if he is found to be physically qualified shall send him to the nearest mobilization camp. In either case the local board sending the registrant to camp shall immediately notify the local board of origin of the camp to which the deserter has been sent by it, enclosing three copies of form 1010 if the physical examination has been conducted by a board other than board of origin, and requiring the local board of origin to furnish direct to such camp the following mobilization papers, which will be sent to the mobilization camp by the local board of origin together with a letter stating the papers cover the registrant examined therein and that he has been sent to camp as a deserter by the local board (naming it) before

"which he appeared as a deserter:

1. One copy of new form 1029 (in duplicate) in respect of the registrant, filling in the data as of the day the local board of origin was informed by the local board of transfer of the registrant apprehension.
2. One copy of form 1029A and B in respect of the registrant dating same as in (one).
3. One copy of form one (registration card) in respect of the registrant.
4. Two copies of form 1010 in respect of the registrant.

The local board sending the deserter to camp will, at the time it notifies the local board of origin, inform the commanding officer of the mobilization camp that it will entrain the deserter (naming him) for camp and that the local board or origin (naming it) will furnish the necessary mobilization papers direct to the commanding officer of the mobilization camp.

Borree, Adjutant General, U.S.A. under date of January 10, 1918.

2. This office is of the opinion that the evidence is insufficient to warrant the cancellation of the registration of Patrick J. Ruane, in fact the enclosures contain no legal evidence except the affidavit of Patrick J. Ruane himself. In view of Ruane's registration and the presumption of law, that all men know and understand the full legal import of their acts, it is reasonable to assume that he believed himself to be within the registration age at the time he registered. His affidavit does not deny the fact that he so believed, nor state any other fact which would tend to overcome this presumption caused by his voluntary act of registration. Evidently he relies on the so-called certificate of birth attached to his affidavit. This certificate of birth would not be accepted as competent evidence in any court in the United States. It bears no seal of office, no certificate, of any other official to the effect that the signature thereto attached is the proper custodian of the records of Birth and Deaths in the county in which it purports to have been issued, and no other indication of authentication, as required by law.

3. In view of the many and obvious attempts to escape the Selective Draft, it is not believed to be good

policy, nor within the requirements of justice, to relieve any man from its operations, who has once voluntarily placed himself within its pale, and thereby declared himself to be subject to its provisions, except upon clear and convincing legal proof that he made a mistake in registering.

Replying, your attention is directed to the fact that local boards have no power whatsoever to determine the question of classification on industrial grounds. Its opinion, in cases of this kind, is merely advisory to the District Board, which makes the classifications in all such cases.

This office has been furnished with no instructions defining industrial classifications, other than those contained in the Selective Service Regulations, and the various telegraphic communications sent out by the Provost Marshal General. None of these undertake to give a definite list of the industries, or the specific employees, which come within this classification. The regulations provide certain fixed general rules, and it is left to the boards, exercising their sound discretion upon the facts of each case as it arises, to determine the classification of persons claiming to be within this class. Therefore, it has not been deemed wise or expedient to undertake to construe the regulations for the boards; and we do not intend to do so.
