In order to properly complete the induction of these men, it is necessary for you to make out a complete set of induction papers for each of these registrants, as provided by Section 148, S.S.R., and forward them by first mail to Local Board No. 3, Juneau, so they may have the papers to forward with the men to the training camp on the 15th. Please see that these papers get out on the next mail.

3. With reference to Rudolph Jabert, Ketchikan, order number 1, serial No. 126, Joe Joseph, Ketchikan, order number 35, serial No. 71, Harry Gillis, Ketchikan, order number 39, serial No. 146, Frank Casey, Hadley, *uron* order number 49, serial No. 17, and Seigard Andrew Mark Ketchikan, Order Number 15, serial No. 124, forward a complete set of induction papers for these men to Local Board No. 4, Ketchikan, with instructions issue transportation request to send these men to Juneau, provided they can be present in time to reach here by the fifteenth. If they cannot reach here by the fifteenth, have a transportation request issued direct

to Haines, and have them inducted and sent directly to the training camp, Fort William H. Seward, Haines, on the first boat arriving at Ketchikan on or after the fifteenth. Keep in touch with these boards and with the registrants by wire so to insure their prompt induction. Also wire this office a complete list of the names, addresses and order numbers of all men in your current quota together with the steps being taken to get them into service. If the names of the men inducted in the list you sent me are not all eligible for service at this time, because of the fact that the classification of some of them may still be pending before the local or district boards, pass over them and induct others in their place.

4. In view of the fact that so many of your registrants are located here and at Ketchikan, it will be cheaper to send any additional registrants which you may induct from Sitka, by commercial boat, instead of sending a special boat for them. Therefore, you will induct any such registrants in time for them to arrive here by the fifteenth if possible; and, if it is not possible for them to arrive here by that date, you will issue the usual induction papers and transportation requests directly to Fort William H. Seward at Haines. Get your entire quota of sixteen into the service as near the fifteenth as possible.

"An informed attorney Stanton has gone outside and am therefore recommending appointment of George W. Albrecht to succeed him as member Iditarod City exemption board."

The files of this Board do not, however, disclose any communication from the Governor to you relative to this substitution. If the Governor made a recommendation, the copy thereof evidently has been placed in some office file other than the selective draft files. We are unable to locate any such communication, but, the oath of office of Mr. Albrecht, executed February 13, 1918, is on file in this office, and he has acted as a member of this board ever since the date of the telegram to Mr. LaPlant, above referred to. It therefore, is respectfully recommended that you confirm this appointment as of Sept. 4, 1917.

SUBJECT: Explanation of General Telegram No. A-4450.

This office is in receipt of letter from the Provost Marshal General, as follows:

1. From inquiries reaching this office it appears that our general telegram No. A-4450 is not thoroughly understood by Local and District Boards with respect to certain points and that the authority thereunder is being somewhat abused by boards with respect to their rights and the proper procedure in extending time, receiving new evidence, reopening cases and reclassifying registrants.

2. The Selective Service Regulations, as explained and interpreted in telegram A-4450, do not authorize Local Boards to reopen cases and reclassify registrants arbitrarily and because they do not agree with the decision of the District Boards. The principal purpose of the telegram No. A-4450 was to call to the attention of the boards their authority to reopen cases where additional evidence must show that an injustice had been committed, or where boards have misinterpreted or misapplied the regulations.

3. Any Local Board which reopens a case and reclassified a registrant simply for the purpose of attempting to substitute its judgment for the judgment of the District Board is acting in violation of the spirit and intent of the Regulations.

4. When the Regulations were promulgated, and when telegram No. A-4450 was prepared, careful consideration was given to the possibility that Local Boards might use the power to reverse District Boards. It was considered, however, that no danger would result from the proper application of the Regulations. If, in a given case, the Local Board has denied a registrant's claim, and the case has gone to the District Board, it has necessarily gone on an appeal by the registrant or by someone in his behalf, or a government appeal agent. If the District Board should reverse the Local Board, and allow the registrant's claim, and after the return of the case to the Local Board it should improperly

reopen the case and reclassify the registrant as result of which the registrant's claim is again denied, the registrant or any other person in his behalf, or a government appeal agent, of course the same right of appeal to the District Board as formerly, and this would result in an endless chain and cause serious delay in the administration of the law.

5. The intent and spirit of the Selective Service Regulations and the interpretation placed on certain sections thereof by telegram No. A-4450 is to work as complete justice as possible and give both the Government and the registrant opportunity to adduce all pertinent facts and secure proper classification. Local Boards must give the same weight and deference to decisions of a district board as a trial court must give to the decision of an appellate court.

6. Any additional or new evidence considered by local boards, upon which classification is asked or granted, must be in writing, duly verified and filed with the board with a certificate attached stating that the evidence submitted has not heretofore been submitted to the local or district board, and assigning the reason for the failure to procure and submit said evidence at the time of filing the questionnaire.

7. Evidence which is merely cumulative and of an identical character with that theretofore considered by the local or district board, shall not be sufficient to justify the reopening of a case or reclassification of a registrant.

8. If the local board shall decide to reopen a case and reclassify a registrant, the procedure for reclassification is governed by the provisions of Section 120, S.S.R. If the District Board shall decide to reopen a case and reclassify a registrant, the procedure for reclassification is governed by Section 121, S.S.R.

9. Paragraph seven of our No. A-4450 recites "Induction of the registrant into military service shall not be stayed by the District or Local Boards on account of the reopening of his case." On March 6th, our No. B-20, referring to our No. A-4450, instructed; "No man whose classification is still pending before a local or district board should be inducted into military service." Apparently, these statements are conflicting. The rule is that if either a local board or district board has

reopened a case and proceeded to reclassification prior to actual induction under Section 157, i.e. prior to the day and hour named in Form 1028, induction should be stayed, and if the board finally grants deferred classification, the induction order should be cancelled. If, however, a board has not actually proceeded or determined to reclassify, the induction shall not be stayed, notwithstanding the fact that applications or additional affidavits have been filed but not acted upon by the board.

10. If a local board has reopened a case and reclassified a registrant after receipt of new evidence, it is not necessary for the government appeal agent to appeal the case to the district board, unless it is one of a class in which specific instructions to do so have been issued, or unless the appeal agent believes the decision erroneous. If general instructions are issued directing government appeal agents to take all cases of a certain class to the district boards on appeal, those instructions should be complied with. In the absence of this, however, an appeal agent does not necessarily have to reclass and take a second appeal, if a case has been reopened and reclassified by a local board after the presentation of new evidence, and especially if the appeal agent believes the case to have been properly and justly disposed of upon reclassification. It is not necessary in every case reconsidered by a local board upon presentation of new evidence, that an appeal be taken for the sole reason that the case has once been taken before the district board.

The obligation imposed upon every loyal citizen by the necessities of this war, require that every person who can contribute to the success of our arms, to put forth their best efforts to do so. Few people realize the tremendous importance to civilization, as well as to this country alone, of the issues which are being contested in this war. There is no doubt, that when future historians record the facts with reference to this great controversy, those who contributed materially to its success will be credited with having aided in the preservation of civilization. The question is: shall civilized institutions and the principals of Liberty, upon which this Government is founded, prevail, or shall they be crushed out to give way for an autocracy, which would usher in a reign of feudalism, little short in its repression of the rights of the people, of that which reigned in the dark ages. It is confidently believed that you will not hesitate to put forth every effort to prevent such calamity.
