Subject: Erroneous classification of J. P. Jelle.

1. This office transmits to you, herewith, letter from Local Board No. 5, City of Petersburg, Petersburg, Alaska, to Captain J. T. Hunt May 5, 1918. You will observe that the Local Board says you overruled their decision in the case of the registrant J. P. Jelle, order number 59, serial number 48, and reclassifying him in 5-F.

2. If the facts are as stated in this letter, and you classified him on those grounds, you evidently are in error, and it is respectfully requested that you reconsider the case and reclassify the registrant. In this connection your attention is invited to the third paragraph of note to Section 101, S.S.R., as follows:

"When an alien has declared his intention to become a citizen, regardless of how long ago, he is still liable to draft, even though he has not in the meantime applied for final papers."

Your attention is further directed to that portion of Section 2 of the Selective Service Law which reads as follows:

"Such draft as herein provided shall be based upon liability to military service of all male citizens, or male persons not alien enemies who have declared their intention to become citizens between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-one years both inclusive, and shall take place and be maintained under such

"regulations as the President may prescribe inconsistent with the terms of this Act."

3. The fact that this registrant visited Norway temporarily after declaring his intention to become a citizen of the United States, does not, in the opinion of this office, in the least affect his liability to military service. The crucial question is: Has he ever, at any time, declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States? If he has he is liable for military service, and no act of his other than leaving this country and remaining permanently out of its jurisdiction would release him from that liability. And, in fact, it is doubtful whether, in law, such an act of his would have that effect. It is clear, however, that a mere temporary absence after which he returned and has remained in this country four years would not have such effect.

He showed us a telegram directed to him from the Petersburg, Alaska, Local Board, dated May 20th, directing him to report to this Board not later than 10:00 a.m. on the 23rd. To make the matter wholly formal, we delivered to the man a copy of form 1028 with the time properly filled in for 10:00 a.m. on the 23rd of May, and impressed upon him the necessity of his reporting for entrainment, and the seriousness of the consequences if he failed to report. We then allowed him to proceed on his recognizance, directing to report to this Board at 11:00 a.m. on May 24th for entrainment.

"It was necessary to bring the man before the Board at 11:00 a.m. accompanied by a police officer, and at that time he again refused to be mobilized or entrained. We again impressed upon him the seriousness of this refusal, but he persisted in his refusal and said that he was willing to take the consequences. Thereupon the Board delivered to the police officer form 1021, holding the man a willful deserter, and he has this day been sent to Fort Lawton under arrest.

"It appeared from the examination of the man that he is a declarant, having taken out his first papers about three years ago in the Superior Court of King County, Washington. He has been physically examined and found qualified. We are notifying the Petersburg Board of our action.

"The attitude of this man will get him not less than twenty years. We might add that he was a very intelligent fellow, spoke and wrote English perfectly, and knew the consequences of each and every step.

"This office is receiving information that many Local and District Boards are receiving letters and telegrams either sent to them or purporting to be sent to them from some branch of Government departments or bureaus in Washington or elsewhere. Some of these communications are genuine, but are without authority and should be ignored. Some are forgeries and are fraudulent. Impress upon Local Boards that they are to receive and observe instructions only from the GOVERNOR, or the ADJUTANT GENERAL, or the DRAFT EXECUTIVE, or in rare cases of emergency instructions issued direct to such Boards by the PROVOST MARSHAL GENERAL. It is, of course, proper for Government officials and others to communicate in the manner provided in the Regulations directly with Local and District Boards concerning registrants and to furnish the Boards the prescribed forms, affidavits and information required or authorized by the Regulations; but there is no authority in any person to issue any instructions to Boards except as specifically prescribed in the Regulations as above stated.

"Forgery and other fraudulent means are being resorted to by private individuals in order to mislead Boards concerning facts affecting liability to military duty. Caution boards to scrutinize carefully all communications purporting to be official and in cases of doubt or suspicion to refer the matter immediately to you. Fraudulent communications of the sort are likely to be resorted to in connection with the approaching registrations, especially upon the question of age.

"Promptly report to this office any and all cases which appear suspicious or where any unauthorized person, officer or department attempts to instruct or control action of boards."
