First. We understand that Arvid Hill has reported, filed questionnaire and passed the physical examination, as directed by his local board.

Second. Regarding William Lind, who was listed on your report Form 1013 of May 23, 1918. Delinquent order has not yet been issued. However, if he remains delinquent, no opportunity should be given him to evade the draft, and you will of course have his case passed on at the earliest possible time.

Third. In the case of James Hay, the Local Board at Juneau was requested to summons him, but we are informed that he has not yet reported. Advise that you make effort to ascertain his present address, and if it appears that he is endeavoring to evade the draft, report him promptly as a delinquent, first on Form 1012, and then on Form 1013 to this office.

Fourth. Hiram H. Allison we are unable to locate through Lynch Brothers or others at Juneau. We would, however, direct your attention to your Mr. Murray's letter to this office under date of May 13th last, wherein it was stated -

"Received your instructions yesterday to extend no more time to file questionnaires. H. H. Allison's questionnaire was returned us same mail, not found, from Juneau. Allison is at Prince Rupert, B.C. We re-mailed him questionnaire, instructed him to fill out same and return; also directed him to report nearest local board for physical examination. Explained his status, told him this was done for his convenience, and expedition in general, and advised him to immediately communicate you by wire, that you might give him different instructions. We specifically informed we could not extend time.

On April 6th we received wire from Allison requesting wire to local board No. 2, Spokane, Wash., authorizing permit to go to Canada.

We answered:

'Local Board No. 2, Spokane, Wash.
H.H.Allison, Serial No. 126, Order

1. Reference your letter of June 1st. This office is of the opinion that you have correctly interpreted the Regulations in respect of appeals from the decision of examining physician. We have not been informed that the majority of your board is dissatisfied with the doctor's finding in the Bersvin Larsen case; neither does it appear that there was any doubt in the doctor's mind as to the registrant's qualifications for general military service. Dr. Kyvig's report on this registrant states that he found him "physically qualified for general military service." In Section 122 of the Selective Service Regulations it is provided,

"If the registrant is not satisfied with such conclusion he shall then and there (at the time of place of his examination) record, in the place provided on Form 1010, a request to be sent before a Medical Advisory Board. Failure to make this request on the day the registrant is examined and informed of the examining physician's conclusion shall foreclose the right of the registrant to appeal the finding of the Local Board on the physical qualification of the registrant."

2. Recent instructions received from the Provost Marshal General state that registrants having hernias of any kind or degree shall not be inducted for general military service.

3. The Selective Service Regulations further provide that you may make special reports to the District Board, etc., where Local and Advisory Boards are at variance.

4. You will always bear in mind the fact that these matters are entirely in the jurisdiction of the Local and District Boards.

The writer has been informed that Salstrom was one of the Swedes that adhered to the idea that this Government would not dare to force them to serve in the Army, whether they filed a questionnaire or not; neither could the Government fine them."



1. With further reference to our letter of June 11th; We are transmitting to you herewith this registrant's Questionnaire, completed by him on the 10th day of June, 1918; also letter from Local Board No. 4 under date of June 10th, regarding this delinquency.

2. Please note that this office issued on May 11th, 1918, delinquent order Form 14, directing this registrant to report to this office for instructions not later than 10:00 A. M., May 21st, 1918; that this delinquent order was mailed to this registrant at Port Walter, Alaska; that this registrant reported to this office by wire from Port Walter Alaska under date of June 8th, 1918; that having failed to report prior to the day and hour specified in the delinquent order, he was from and after the day and hour so specified, in the Military Service of the United States, and this office has no power to stay or rescind that order.

3. It rests with your Board to classify this registrant as prescribed in the S.S.R. In this connection, your attention is directed to Section 129, which reads as follows:

"Any registrant, except an alien enemy, who fails to return the Questionnaire on the date required shall be deemed to have waived all right for filing claims and proof for deferred classification, shall stand classified in Class I, and be so recorded by the Local Board, subject, however, to the rights and privileges of other persons to apply to the Local Board for deferred classification of the registrant, and to the right of the registrant or other persons to apply for an extension of time, as provided in section 99. •

4. Whether or not this delinquent be inducted immediately, this case must be reported to the Commanding Officer of the nearest mobilization camp. For this purpose, please furnish this office with such information as will be required for a full report of all the circumstances of the case. This office has felt compelled to ask for the removal of Mr. Blue as a Member of the Local Board at Ketchikan for the reasons as stated in our letter to him of this date, a copy of which is herewith enclosed.

Your attention is particularly directed to the remarks concerning the Provisions of Rules 27 and 32 of Section 101 - S.S.R. Had you been alive to your duties, those provisions would not have been ignored.

We find also that the instructions contained in our telegrams of April 1st and April 11th have, to a certain extent, been ignored.

In conclusion, it is the hope of this office that another reference to matters of this character will be unnecessary. We cannot too strongly impress upon you the absolute necessity of becoming thoroughly familiar with the regulations. Whenever in doubt as to the construction of same, you are at liberty to wire us for an interpretation.

Confirming our wire of today, No. A-560, as follows:

"By order of the President, M. S. Dobbs has been appointed Member of Local Board No. Four at Ketchikan in your place. Transfer all papers and records to Dobbs. RIGGS, Governor."

This action has been taken after a thorough investigation of the work of the Local Board No. 4, and is based upon delinquencies and failures as follows:

1st. You assumed original jurisdiction and acted upon all industrial claims for deferred classification when the character of the claim was such that the registrant could not consistently be given a Class 2C or Class 2D grade.

2nd. Claims for deferred classification, based on industry and of such a character as to grade the registrant in either Class 2C or Class 2D, if granted, were referred to the District Board, but not in accordance with Section 105, (1) and (3) S.S.R.; these claims were allowed to accumulate until May 14th, before being sent to the District Board. Questionnaires were thus held by the Local Board as long as two months. There is no reason or excuse why the questionnaires were not forwarded in strict accordance with the Regulations. This has resulted in holding in abeyance for periods up to two months the final classification of certain registrants.

On the whole, your Board has shown fair diligence in the execution of the Selective Service law but has failed lamentably in becoming familiar with the regulations. As a consequence your Board has failed to fulfil its duties in three vital instances -:

- 1st In neglect to follow Rules 27 and 32-Sec. 101 S.S.R.
- 2nd Neglect to follow Sec. 105 (1) and (3) S.S.R.
- 3rd Neglect to follow Section 92-99 and Sections 129-130 S.S.R.

6 The effect of this neglect in (1) and (3) is the possibility that certain registrants having high order numbers should be, but

are not, in the first quota.

The effect of neglect in (2) is positive - i.e. - Certain High order numbers should have been, but were not, included in the first quota.

The investigation into the work of your Board discloses that these faults are mainly traceable to yourself. Mr. Heneghan and Dr. Meyer are not wholly free from blame, but not to the extent that you are.

For the reasons herein given, this office has asked for your removal.
