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

1. We enclose herewith quota sheet, as requested in your letter of May twenty-seventh; also report of Class I.

2. The entries in column 2 of the quota sheet and the report of Class I, and the totals for the Territory in the columns three to nine of the report of Class I, likewise, are the figures reported to you in our reply to your telegram No. E-996.

3. While we have not the assurance that the reports from all of our local boards are accurate in this first report, we are nevertheless confident that we shall in future be able to furnish accurate and complete reports. The new regulations were forwarded to the boards together with the Form 2002A, and will be used by the boards in making their reports of Class I hereafter.

4. The next report of Class I will, we feel confident, show a somewhat higher percentage strength of Class I than the report which we have given you in this instance. By reason of the necessity in many cases to extend the time for the return of questionnaires of registrants who had moved from the Territory or had gone to inaccessible parts of Alaska, the completion of the classifications has been retarded. However, since the routes opened and the mails were received containing the questionnaires, the boards have taken up the work of completing the classifications. All have been directed to exert their efforts to round up delinquents, *and* review the cases where there was any doubt in respect of previous classification.

On December 29th, 1917, the Provost Marshal General wired as follows:

"If a registrant has a wife but no children and there are such other sources of support available that the removal of the registrant will not deprive the wife of reasonably adequate support he goes in Class One as not being included in any other division in the schedule."

On June 28th, 1918, at your request, we wired the Provost Marshal General as follows:

"Is the third paragraph of your Telegram A-1923, construed as Amendment of paragraph F, Section 73? This office so construes."

The Provost Marshal General replies under date of July 3rd:

"Our telegram A-1923 not intended as Amendment Section 73, Paragraph F, but indicates that where removal of registrant will not deprive dependents of reasonably adequate support, registrant goes in Class 1, but support of parents and parents-in-law of dependent wife or child must be considered."

While this is not a clear and specific answer to the point in question, if taken in connection with the telegram of December 29th, etc., can lead to no other conclusion but that

the support tendered, or able to be tendered a registrant's dependents, should be taken into consideration in considering the dependent's status of the registrant. As stated in the last telegram, it is "indicated" that such would be a proper construction.

Note also in this connection Paragraph "C" of Section 72, Changes 5, Page 3.



Subject:- Regulation relating to cases involving marriage since May 18, 1917 -- Amendment Rule V, Section 72, S.S.R. -- Provost Marshal General's telegrams Nos. B-1475 and B-1921.

1. The Provost Marshal General's telegrams, amending Rule V of Section 72 of the Selective Service Regulations, are as follows:

"No. B-1475. Please promulgate at once to Local Boards the following important amendment to the Selective Service Regulations:

"Rule V, Section 72, S.S.R., is amended to read as follows:

"Rule V-a. The fact of dependency resulting from the marriage of a registrant who has become twenty-one years of age since June 5th, 1917, and who has married since the date of the introduction of the joint resolution in Congress requiring his registration, to-wit: January 15, 1918, will be disregarded as ground for deferred classification. If a registrant who has attained to age of twenty-one since June 5, 1917, and who has contracted marriage subsequent to the date of the enactment of the Selective Service law, to-wit: May 18, 1917, but on or prior to January 15, 1918, claims deferred classification on the ground of dependency resulting from his marriage, the fact of dependency resulting from his marriage will be disregarded as a ground for deferred classification, unless the dependent is a child of the marriage, born or unborn on or prior to June 9, 1918, in which case such registrant upon satisfactory proof being made shall be classified in Class 2. If a registrant, other than one who has attained the age of twenty-one years since June 5, 1917, who has contracted marriage since May 18, 1917, claims deferred classification on the ground of dependency resulting from his marriage, the fact of dependency resulting from his marriage will be disregarded as a ground for deferred classification, unless the dependent is a child of the marriage, born or unborn on or before June 9, 1918, in which case such a registrant upon satisfactory proof being made shall be placed in Class 2. Nothing contained in this amendment to Rule V shall be construed as requiring the

"transfer to Class 2 of any registrant who has been
"finally classified in Class 1 on the affirmative find-
"ing that his marriage since May 18, 1918, was made with
"the primary view of evading military service.
"Instruct all Local Boards forthwith to reclassify
"all cases involving marriage since May 18, 1917, in
"accordance with the above."

"No. B-1921. General telegram B-1475 applies to
"every marriage solemnized subsequent to May 18, 1917.
"Dependency resulting therefrom to be disregarded
"unless dependent is child of such marriage, born or
"unborn on or before June 9, 1918. Unless there is such,
"this class of registrants must be placed in Class 1."

2. You will accordingly re-classify in all cases involving marriage, to conform with the foregoing amendment. Note that the amendment not only covers cases of marriage since May 18, 1917, by men who were registered during the first registration in Alaska and subsequent thereto, but will apply also to the cases of men who reached the age of twenty-one years since September 2, 1917, and who are registered, or subject to registration, during the present registration in Alaska.

The remainder only is called from the First and Third Divisions at this time to make up the required number under induction call No. 880, and your board is to furnish by August first only 7 men, and on a later order your board will be called upon to induct the balance of your current quota. Your net current quota is 26 men, as you have been advised.

3. While the press announced the call for three hundred men from the Territory, the contents of the message from the Provost Marshal General to this office, which we wired you, should not be given out to the public.

4. We trust that the foregoing will give you a clearer understanding of the matter. You can feel assured that your board will be called upon to furnish no more than an equitable proportion of the men to be furnished.

It is not absolutely essential that the columns relating to ratios and percentages be filled out, but, if done, would be greatly appreciated.

It is appreciated that the compiling of certain Tables will demand considerable work. We suggest, however, that it be undertaken concurrently with your re-classification which is now in progress. Table No. 14 should, if possible, be compiled by the Medical Member of the Board. If he is unable to examine every case he should examine sufficient number, which in his opinion, would give a fair approximation of the total. In that event he should in Line I of Table 14, insert the word "estimated".

In addition to the Tables herewith enclosed, it is particularly desired that the following information be tabulated and forwarded.

- 1st. Number of Registrants inducted under Call 191, or any Special Call you may have received.
- 2nd. Number of Registrants inducted or enrolled for whom you have not received credit on Form 2004 sent you July 1st.
- 3rd. A conservative estimate of the number of men without the draft age actually residing within your jurisdiction who have joined the Military forces.
- 4th. A statement, based on your experience, relative to the Selective Service Law; with attempted evasions thereof and recommendations for the future, would be greatly appreciated.

All the information herein desired has relation only to your actions prior to June 30th, 1918. Registrations, inductions, etc., after that date should be disregarded.

Reference to the regulations shows that a registrant who desires to enlist, will be required to register under the jurisdiction of some local board, his serial and order numbers will be thereafter determined, and he will subsequently be classified, in the manner set out in the Regulations. Section 56 of the Regulations provide that "citizens, and persons who have declared their intention to become citizens, residing abroad are not required to register, but any such citizen or person may do so by applying to the nearest American consulate to have his registration card filled out."

4. Registrants who are qualified may enlist in the Aviation Section, or other departments or branches of the Army where enlistments are permitted. Your attention is directed, in this connection, to Section 151 of the Selective Service Regulations, and particularly to sub-paragraph "e" (which is found under Section 151, Changes S. S. R. No. 2). "Section 162. Certificate of Final Classification to be Taken up when Registrant is Inducted. Upon the calling of the roll as provided in Section 163, a member of the Local Board shall immediately take up the certificate of final classification of each selected man, or obtain a complete explanation regarding the disposition that he has made of the same. In cases of voluntary or any form of special or individual induction, the same procedure will be followed at the time of the delivery of Form 1029 A and B to the inducted man. This course is necessary, in order to prevent persons, who have not performed the duties imposed on them by the Selective Service Law, from obtaining possession of the certificates of men who have been inducted into the military service, and, by impersonating such men or changing the names on the certificates, evading military service. The certificate should be placed in the cover sheet of the questionnaire. If the certificate is not surrendered the Local Board shall immediately report that fact and the man's explanation to the Adjutant General, who shall immediately forward such report to the Provost Marshal General."

SUBJECT: LEASE OF QUARTERS FOR LOCAL BOARD NO.13.

1. Referring to your letter of July 11th. We are returning to you herewith the several copies of the lease which you prepared and executed, and are also enclosing five blanks to be used by you in re-writing the same, to be executed in proper form.

2. All the instructions which appear on page three of Form 101 should be followed.

3. In addition thereto, the lease should preferably be executed on behalf of the Bank of Seward by its President or Vice-President, and its seal should be affixed. The lease can be so executed by forwarding it to the proper officers if they do not happen to be at Seward when the lease is ready for execution. The Bank should obtain from the proper Government officers the required number of certificates showing its status as a corporation and that it has paid its license fees.

4. The lease should be executed by the Chairman of your Board, for and in behalf of the United States.

5. The execution of the lease should be properly witnessed, in the space indicated for witnesses' signatures.

6. The lease should preferably be typewritten and all the copies made at one writing. We would suggest that you include at the foot of page three, an approval indorsement for the Governor to sign, which may be in the following form:

"The foregoing lease has this day been examined
by me and is hereby approved.

Dated at Juneau, Alaska, this _____ day of _____,
1918.

Governor of Alaska."

7. With reference to filling in the blanks under the word "Lease" at the top of the first page of the lease form: In the second line show the name of the contracting officer and the name of the local board. In the fifth line, after the word "appropriation" show "Registration and Selection for Military Service." In the sixth line, the date of the lease should be the date on which

the lease forms are actually executed by your Board and the Lessor; and the date following the words "Date expires" should be the date one month later than the date on which the lease became effective.

8. The date to be filled in in Article 1 (on page 1) should conform to the actual arrangement which your Board has made with the Lessor of the premises as to the date from which the lease is to run, as stated after the words "Date effective" in the sixth line under the word "lease" at the top of the first page.

9. The lease can be made to provide for the automatic renewal of it from month to month, not to extend beyond June 30, 1919, if not sooner terminated under its terms. Your board may provide for the right to renew the lease, at its option, upon the same terms, if authorized to arrange such a renewal within ten days after the date fixed for its expiration, not to extend beyond June 30, 1919.

10. It is requested that you have five copies of the lease executed. You should address a letter to the Auditor for the War Department, Washington, D.C., transmitting the original copy of the lease for filing in that office, and the letter with the accompanying copy of the lease should be sent to this office with the other three copies, so that the Governor's approval may be endorsed thereon. This office will then forward your communication and the original copy of the lease to the Auditor for the War Department. One copy of the lease may be retained by your Board, and you will be advised of the Governor's approval, so that notation may be made on your copy. The third copy of the lease will be sent by you to the Lessor. The other two copies will be used as follows: One copy retained for file in this office, and the other copy will be forwarded by this office to the Provost Marshal General.

11. On the copy of the lease to be sent to the Auditor for the War Department, you should execute the affidavit form on page 3, immediately preceding the instructions.

12. Now, as to vouchers covering the rental, they should, of course, be submitted monthly, signed by the Lessor and certified by your Chairman.
