Referring to Mr. Robinson's wire of July 13th regarding the above named registrant;

On July 24th the Special Agent, Department of Justice, Seattle wired this office that Habeas Corpus proceedings were pending. We are now in receipt of letter from the Local Board for Division No. 10, Seattle, stating that Emirzas was released on July 20th, and that he was given a Questionnaire which he filled out and mailed to your Board, since which time he has been given permission to go to Stockton, California to work. In addition, information is given that mail addressed to 123 Prefontaine Place, Seattle, will be forwarded to him.

It is unfortunate that this man could not have been held, but, as you know, he was not reported by your Board on Form 1013 until July 8th. The delinquent orders were issued by this office promptly on receipt of the list from your Board, but we could not limit the time too closely in justice to the registrants, and in the case of Emirzas, as you will note if you will refer to delinquent order No. D-238, the time specified for induction is August 12th, 1918. When delinquents are apprehended prior to the time specified for induction their cases are treated as prescribed in Section 135 SSR. If they fail to report prior to the time specified for induction, their cases are handled as prescribed in Section 137 SSR.

We again urge upon you the importance of keeping this office fully informed in respect of each and every delinquent who reports to your Board.

In accordance with instructions issued by the Provost Marshal General in telegram No. B-294, which was quoted in our circular letter of March 27th, 1918, a copy of

each delinquent order Form 1014, showing the name of the registrant under the words "delinquent order number", is being sent you.

He addressed a letter to Board objecting to classification I-A, and the Board reconsidered his case, and finding that a mistake had been made, reclassified him in V-F. Although Sandberg made demand for classification IV-A, the Board disregarded the letter because he was not married until March, 1918. The Board wrote to Sandberg, requesting him to return his classification card in order that new classification card showing V-F should be issued.

(d) If registrant has been inducted into military service then the date on which he was so inducted, the date on which he was sent to his mobilization camp, together with the name of such camp, and the designation of the unit to which he is attached, if such information is available.

(e) If the registrant has not been inducted into military service, please inform this office as to the exact date on which he will be inducted into service and the exact date on which he will be sent to his mobilization camp, together with the name of such camp, just as soon as and when that information is available.

1. This office is in receipt of a telegram from the Provost Marshal General, under date of August 19, 1918, as follows:

"No. B-2682. Fully realizing the difficulties of securing and maintaining competent and ample clerical forces for State Headquarters and for Local, District and Medical Advisory Boards, and in anticipation of the largely increased volume of work which will result from the enactment into law of the bill now pending in Congress to increase the age limit, and the necessity for expeditiously classifying the new registrants, in order to be ready to attend instantly to all calls for men, this office has requested and secured authority to induct into service, either as privates or in noncommissioned grades for clerical and administrative work at State Headquarters, and at Local, District and Medical Advisory Boards, Class I registrants who are physically disqualified for general military service but qualified for special or limited military service and also specially qualified for such clerical and administrative work. Detailed instructions concerning the induction of such registrants, their mustering in, the noncommissioned rank which may be allowed in certain cases, etc., will be issued in due course. Until such instructions are promulgated and specific authority issued by this office for the induction of such registrants, no steps should be taken, except that Boards ought to make careful inspection of their lists of Class I

limited service men qualified as clerks and ascertain whether or not there may be some registrants in deferred classes who will be willing to waive deferred classification and be inducted for this purpose. Local Boards should make a tentative list of such men, bearing in mind that such registrants will be needed not only for Local Boards but also for State Headquarters and District and Medical Advisory Boards. Promulgate this immediately and fully to Local, District and Medical Advisory Boards.

Send this office as soon as possible a list of Class I limited service men qualified as clerks, also names of registrants in deferred classes who may be willing to waive deferred classification and be inducted for such work. Advise us as to their qualifications.
