This office is in receipt of telegram from the Provost Marshal General under date of August 30th, 1918, as follows:

"No. B-3710. The following additional paragraph has been added to Section 77, Rule III, at the end of said paragraph and Rule: "When a claim is made for deferred classification under subsections F, G, H or I of this Rule and is supported by the affidavit of necessity or certificate of approval which complies with the requirements of these regulations, such affidavit of necessity and certificate of approval shall be considered as prima facie evidence of the fact that the registrant is a necessary employee as claimed, and he shall be placed in Class III, unless other substantial evidence is received by the Local Board sufficient, in the judgment of the Board, to rebut such prima facie evidence and to prove that the registrant is not a necessary employee as claimed. In case such a claim is made and is properly supported for such classification on behalf of a registrant found upon physical examination to be disqualified for general military service, the Local Board shall grant the claim and place the registrant in Class III, notwithstanding he may have been placed in some other class prior to such physical examination and finding as to his physical disqualification, unless evidence other than the affidavit of necessity and the certificate of approval conclusively proves that such registrant is not a necessary employee as claimed."

"Promulgate the foregoing immediately to all Local Boards with instructions that they have authority to reopen and reclassify registrants who have been placed in Class I and found not qualified for general military service but qualified for special or limited service in behalf of whom deferred classification was requested as necessary government employee and was denied."

Having reference to our circular letter of July 25, 1918, relating to the British and Canadian conventions, etc. Referring to the last paragraph of the telegram No. B-1974 (communicated in the Provost Marshal General's telegram No. B-2199):

"Paragraph "h" of Section 151 is hereby amended by the addition of the following after subparagraph number 2 thereof:

On request of any registrant, or of a recruiting officer of the British-Canadian Recruiting Mission, Local Boards shall furnish to any registrant who has stated on his registration card that he is a British subject, or a Canadian, a certificate in the following form, either in writing or by telegraph: "It is hereby certified that _____, a registrant of this Local Board, stated on his registration card that he is a British subject, or a Canadian." Thereafter, upon receipt by his Local Board of a notification by a commissioned officer of the British or Canadian Army, stating that he has been so enlisted, such notification shall be filed with his questionnaire and the registrant shall be placed in Class V and marked Division K."

SUBJECT: Amendment to Section 151, S. S. R.

An amendment, known as sub-paragraph "h", of Section 151, was communicated by the Provost Marshal General in a letter to Headquarters of all the states under date of June 5, 1918, as follows:

"1. Section 151, S. S. R. is hereby amended by the addition of the following:

"h" Except in the following cases, no person registered or subject to registration under the Selective Service Act may enlist or be recruited in the military forces of co-belligerents of the United States:

(1) Upon presentation by a registrant to a recruiting officer of a co-belligerent of the United States, of a certificate of final classification of his Local Board (Form 1007, P.M.G.O.) showing that he has been placed in Class V (e) on the ground that he is an alien enemy or in Class V (f) on the ground that he is a resident alien who has not declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States, he may enlist in the military forces of a co-belligerent of the United States.

(2) Upon presentation by a registrant to a recruiting officer of a co-belligerent of the United States, of a certificate of his Local Board that he has been found by the Local Board not to be a citizen of the United States and not to have declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States, that he has expressly waived classification in Class V on the ground of alienage, and that the Local Board has placed him in Class II, III, or IV, he may enlist in the Military forces of a co-belligerent of the United States. Form 1007, P.M.G.O., may not be used in this case, but the Local Board shall prepare a special certificate.

Page 2.

(3A) Immediately upon the enlistment of a registrant under the exceptions above noted, the recruiting officer shall forward to the local board a certificate that the registrant has enlisted in the military service of the country which the recruiting officer represents. The local board shall, upon receipt of such certificate of the recruiting officer, place in Class V (f) any registrant who has enlisted under the provisions of the sub-paragraph immediately preceding.

2. If the Local Boards or State Headquarters learn that recruiting officers of foreign countries have enlisted registrants in violation of the above regulation, it is requested that they immediately forward to this office affidavits showing the fact and circumstances of the enlistment and citizenship and classification of the registrant, in order that steps may be taken to obtain his discharge from such military service and return to the place of enlistment."

The following statement appearing in the Official Bulletin on August 9th is self explanatory and will give you the information desired:

"The War Department today has suspended further volunteering and the receipt of candidates for officers' training camps from civil life. This suspension will remain in force until the legislation now pending before the Congress with regard to draft ages is disposed of and suitable regulations drawn up to cover the operation of the selective system under the new law.

This action is taken in order to prevent the disruption of the industry of the country and the impairment of the efficiency of the various governmental agencies which would follow the indiscriminate enlistment of men up to the age of 45. It is the intention of the department to present to the President for promulgation regulations in connection with the operation of the selective system which will make it truly selective and leave it to the Government to determine whether men can be spared from their present occupations for military service.

For your information the following telegram from the Provost Marshal General, under date of August 29th, is herewith forwarded:

1. No. B-2851. You may announce to all Local Boards that the following plan of compensation to Local Boards has been adopted and that regulations and instructions will be issued in the near future.

2. For all services over and above classification and regulation between March 1st and June 30th, 1918, \$3.00 to each Local Board for each registrant inducted into service during said period and accepted in Camp, which will be payable \$1.00 to each Board Member per each man so inducted, or otherwise distributed among Board Members in accordance with detail instructions to issue.

3. For services rendered between July 1st and August 31st, 1918, in addition to the existing allowance of 30 cents per questionnaire finally classified in addition to per diem for registration the same compensation as above stated namely \$3.00 to each Board for each registrant inducted and accepted at Camp between July 1st and August 31st, under the same rules and conditions as explained in foregoing one.

4. On and after September 1st, 1918, all pre-existing regulations concerning compensation of Local Boards will cease to be effective, and from and after September 1st, 1918, such Board Members will be paid a compensation of \$1.00 per hour, not to exceed \$10.00 per day or \$300.00 per month for any Board Member; the maximum compensation allowable per Board to be graduated according to the number of registrants in the jurisdiction of the respective Boards, the scale beginning with small Boards of one thousand registrants

or under, which Boards may receive a maximum compensation of \$150.00 per month per Board or \$50.00 per Board per Member; the top of the scale being Boards with seven thousand registrants and over, which may receive a maximum compensation of \$600.00 per month per Board; such compensation to be divided equally, one-third of the same to go to each member or otherwise distributed among Board Members as set forth in Paragraph I.

5. The foregoing is a mere outline and preliminary statement which will be followed by definite instructions and regulations, and no compensation is to be paid under the foregoing announcement nor until the regulations are received and fully complied with.

1. Territorial Headquarters and most of the Local Boards are in urgent need of the services of competent stenographers rather than clerks as such. As stated in our telegram No. 216 on August 15, 1918, stenographers can be secured in Alaska at a salary not in excess of \$150.00 per month - in most cases for \$135.00.

2. This office is of the opinion that the procedure outlined in your telegram No. B 2682, August 19, 1918, is impracticable and inadvisable in Alaska for the following reasons:

a. A survey of the Alaska registrants in the special or limited service and deferred classes discloses but one solitary stenographer on the list.

b. We are informed that under the plan outlined in your telegram B 2682 the pay of an unmarried private would total \$133.00 per month, and that of an unmarried sergeant \$157.00. Such persons would have to be secured in the States and transported to Alaska. The clothing allowance and transportation charges of such men would amount to a very considerable sum in addition.

c. Only a minority of our twenty Local Boards would have to pay a stenographer \$150.00 per month. The balance can be accommodated under the provisions of Section 43 S.S.R.

d. Your telegram No. B 2651, dated August 28, 1918, outlining a plan of compensation for Local Board members has been transmitted to all Local Boards by mail. It is the judgment of this office that the great majority of the membership of Local Boards would waive any compensation if they were supplied with competent stenographers. In this

connection your attention is especially directed to the fact that only two of the sixty members have so far made application for payment (and well merited) under Section 195; that only four of the boards are employing clerks continuously; and that but three are paying rental charges.

3. In conclusion, it is respectfully submitted that if this office was permitted to authorize a Local Board to employ, when necessary, a stenographer at a salary not in excess of \$150.00 per month, not only would a great saving result to the Government, but also a greater degree of efficiency would mark the work of the Boards.

4. It is respectfully requested that your decision in this matter be announced by telegraph.

Under date of August 23, 1918, the Provost Marshal General has written this office as follows:

1. This office has learned that a practice prevails with some Local Boards of sending men who are rejected at one camp for physical disability to another camp on subsequent call.

2. While it may occasionally happen that men who are honestly believed by Local Boards to be physically qualified have been rejected at camps, the great majority of those rejected at one camp will be again rejected at another, thus causing great expense to the government for transportation, etc.

3. Such practice is regarded by this office as a deliberate violation of the Selective Service Law and Regulations, as expressly set out in Section 177, S.S.R., (See also Page 65, Form 7B, P.M.G.O.). In future, cases of this nature which are reported to the Provost Marshal General, will be investigated with a view of instituting appropriate proceedings against the board members concerned, conformably to Section 6 of the Selective Service Law.

4. If any doubt arises as to rejected men, their cases should be taken up directly with the camp commander, or the facts communicated to this office, as may be most expedient.

5. Please communicate the foregoing promptly to all Local Boards, and require an acknowledgment of the same.

We have gone through our files very thoroughly and do not seem to be able to locate authorization for payment covering the dates mentioned. Since Captain Finnegan has been put in charge of the Military Department and new office help has also become in force it is difficult for us sometimes to locate certain papers. Oct. 25th, 1917 to March 1st, 1918 dates back quite a ways and it would greatly facilitate matters if you would mail us copies of these authorizations, or any correspondence relating thereto. We dislike very much to keep Miss Cochran waiting so long for her money, but it is quite imperative that we have this information before making payment.

Replying to your letter of September 4th.

First: Regarding the letter which you received from the Local Board of Petersburg, Alaska, stating that "Mike Paulson is in the current quota to be called in September or October, and according to advices from the Governor's Office we cannot issue permits in cases of this kind." Answering a wire of August 23rd from the Local Board of Petersburg in which they advised that they had received applications from registrants who desired to enlist in the NAVY, we wired that Board that enlistments were suspended temporarily and that at no time should certificates be issued to permit enlistments in the Navy or in Marine Corps except as provided in Section 151-a.

We will immediately communicate with the Local Board of Petersburg regarding your request for Emergency Fleet classification in this case of Mike Paulson.

Second: The Local Board of Wrangell informs us that Raymond Richey has not kept them informed of his address, and this Board believes that his delinquencies have been due to his efforts to evade the draft. Understanding that he was employed at Chichagof, Alaska, the Board issued an order for his induction in the quota called in July, prior to the receipt of your request for Emergency Fleet classification. We understand that owing to the fact that the Board was unable to reach Richey at the time the quota called in July was required to report they called another registrant for military service. Now, if your request for the Emergency Fleet classification in this case is not withdrawn, the Local Board of Wrangell will comply with your request, in accordance with the Regulations.

We are today communicating with the Local Board of Wrangell regarding this case.

You may feel sure that there is no intention of the part of any one to do otherwise than comply with the Regulations, and such requests as you make will be complied with promptly.
