Referring to your letter of August 28, regarding the six declarants, natives of Norway and Sweden, who were reported in the seventeen Class I registrants, shown on Form 2002-a, as of September 1, 1918, remaining finally classified examined physically and accepted for general military service.

Since your letter was written, Changes No. 6, S.S.R., together with Forms 1041 and 1042, have been forwarded to you. These regulations provide that, -

" Any uninducted registrant, who is a citizen or subject of a country neutral in the present war, and who has declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States but has not completed his citizenship, shall be relieved from liability to military service upon filing an affidavit that he withdraws his intention to become a citizen of the United States.

The Local Board shall mail a notice (Form 1042) to the last known address of (a) each such registrant who has not been placed in Class V (j); or, when the necessary amendments have been made to the questionnaire, (b) each such registrant who has stated in his questionnaire that he wishes to be relieved from liability to military service by withdrawing his intention to become a citizen of the United States. The Local Board shall inclose with each such notice two blank copies of the affidavit (Form 1041) prescribed for making a claim for such relief from liability to military service."

Furthermore, it is provided that,

"The involuntary induction of any such registrant shall be stayed by the Local Board until and including the date specified in the notice, and, in the case of any registrant who files the required affidavit, the Local Board shall continue the stay of involuntary induction until such affidavit has been considered . . . and the registrant has been finally classified by the Local Board and by the District Board if the case is appealed."

We invite your attention to telegram No. B-3876 from the Provost Marshal General, and request that you ask all Legal Advisory Board members to co-operate in the manner suggested in this telegram, as follows:-

"On account of approaching classification of new registrants under new law amending Selective Service Law by increasing ages it is imperative that members of Legal Advisory Boards, both permanent and associate, should be prepared to take up the work of aiding and advising registrants and assisting in the administration of the law and regulations immediately following registration under the new law. Please take up this matter immediately with the Legal Advisory Committee, or through such other means as may be necessary, and arrange for preliminary meetings and other necessary steps to be taken to assure efficient and ample personnel organized and ready to repeat the magnificent work which they did during the first questionnaire and classification period."

Kindly acknowledge receipt of this letter and advise us what steps you are taking to secure the aid and assistance of the members of the Legal Advisory Board.

Subject: Amendment to Sec. 156, S.S.R. -- Permits to depart from United States.

You will be governed by the instructions issued by the Provost Marshal General, under date of September 11, 1918, as follows:

"Number B 3265. Communicate immediately to all Local Boards following amendment to Section 156: 'A Local Board is authorized to issue a permit to depart from the United States to a registrant who has not been finally classified, provided he has submitted a questionnaire, upon which, together with the application on form 1036 P.M.G.O., the Board may determine whether the permit to depart from the United States should be issued. If a registrant who has not been furnished a questionnaire applies for such permit the Local Board shall furnish him a questionnaire and on its return shall proceed in accordance with the above. If the registrant claims deferred classification on the ground that he is totally physically disqualified for military service the Local Board shall proceed immediately to have the registrant examined physically.

If any registrant of a class with respect to age which the President has not directed shall be called for classification (that is furnished with questionnaire) and drafted, for military service applies for a permit under this section and has been furnished a questionnaire to be submitted to the Local Board for consideration in connection with his application for a Permit, he shall not be finally classified or called for military service until under the President's direction the class of registrants with respect to age or which he is a member has been called for classification."

Referring to yours of September 5th., regarding Charles Hims Gordon, who was reported as a deserter by Ft. Lisicum.

Section 137, of the Selective Service Regulations specified the manner in which delinquent cases should be handled where the registrants were found to be disqualified for military service. Gordon was examined by the Medical Advisory Board as well as the Examining Physician of the Local Board, at Juneau, and was reported, "physically qualified for special or limited services as steward on ship," and the Local Board found that his delinquency was not wilful. Now, Amended Section 140, of the Selective Service Regulations, provides in respect of registrants qualified for limited or special service only, default non-wilful, that, -

"If the Local Board finds that the registrant failed to report or otherwise perform any duty described in paragraph 1 above, but without intent to evade military service, and that he is physically qualified for special or limited military service only (Group C), he shall be forwarded on the next general call for men qualified for such special or limited military service."

For your information we are enclosing herewith copies of circulars Nos. 1 and 2, relating to procedure in cases of deserters, under Amended Section 140, S.S.R.

During the campaign against draft evaders in the States a large number of men were detained by the police authorities for failure to present proper evidence of compliance with the Selective Service Law, and in the examination of these men the following conditions were found:

A number of men had been given proper deferred classification by their Local Boards, but had not received a classification notice of any description.

A considerable number of men had received preliminary notice of classification (Form 1005), but had never received Form 1007, final notice of Final Classification.

A number of Final Classification Cards (Form 1007) were produced which were signed by a rubber stamp, in spite of the fact that this practice had been absolutely prohibited by orders from the Provost Marshal General.

The Provost Marshal General calls attention to the necessity for the exercise of the most scrupulous care in the issuance of Final Classification Notices in connection with the registration and classification of men under the Man Power Act, as such notices will constitute the only direct evidence of registrant's compliance with the Selective Service Act.

Your attention is directed to letter received by this office under date of August 22, 1918, from the Provost Marshal General, as follows:

"It is anticipated that, pursuant to legislation now pending, a very large registration will be made.

As the entire work incident to this new draft must necessarily be compressed within a brief period, the machinery of the draft must be repaired, oiled, and otherwise put in perfect condition to function at high speed and with efficiency.

It must not be said afterward that the medical parts of the machine were weaker than the rest, nor that their slow or imperfect action resulted in delay.

To the end that the greatest efficiency may be had, therefore, and the greatest credit accrue to those concerned with the medical operations of the draft, you are instructed to urge upon all medical examiners the enormous importance of the matter; to make them realize that the coming test will be the greatest in the history of the draft; and to impress upon them the fact that the efficiency of our overseas armies depends vitally upon the way in which the test is met by THEM.

A careful but rapid survey must be made of all medical examiners of Local Boards. Weak examiners must be replaced; slow ones must be speeded up. All must be made to realize the emergency.

Medical Advisory Boards must be instructed that examinations must be promptly made, and the papers returned at once. All examiners must be made aware that defects which are obvious even to a layman, reflect discredit on the board as well as on the system.

Analysis of causes of rejection at mobilization camps will indicate weaknesses of individual boards, and suggest the proper remedy."

The following is a copy of a letter addressed to the Surgeon General of the Army. The reply of that official is contained in the first indorsement.

1. The organization of the Provost Marshal General's office for the physical examination of draft registrants has been greatly disturbed recently, by the withdrawal of medical members of draft boards for other duties.
2. The most serious drain of this nature has ensued by reason of the commissioning, in the Medical Reserve Corps of the Army, of many medical board members. During, July, 1918, 106 physicians have been lost from boards in this way.
3. In view of the enormous labor involved in the anticipated registration and examination of fourteen million of men in the next few months, under anticipated legislation, this office feels very strongly that its needs are paramount.
4. It is, therefore, requested that the commissioning of medical members of draft boards be discontinued for the present except in instances where this office consents.
5. It is suggested that before commissioning medical men, inquiry be made by the Surgeon General as to whether or not the candidate is associated with the draft. If the reply is affirmative, the case should be referred to this office for remark.
6. The Provost Marshal General's Office does not wish to hinder the use of available medical material for general army service, but must preserve its own organization.

"No. B-3276. The increasingly large number of resignations of Members of Local Boards threatens a serious impairment of the efficiency and expeditious classification of the new registrants. Hereafter no resignations may be accepted until after reference to this office with complete statement of facts and personal recommendation of the Governor. Under Section 6 of the Selective Service Law, Board Members, having been appointed by the President are compelled to render service until relieved by the President. See Section 33 of the Selective Service Regulations.

Concerning the increasingly large number of retirements of medical members from Local Boards on account of acceptance commissions in Medical Corps of Army, thereby rendering them ineligible to continue as Board Members, this office recently had agreement with Surgeon General of the Army, which was announced to you by general letter of August 23rd. Similar agreements have been reached with Surgeon General of Navy and Surgeon General of Public Health Service, but no definite instructions have yet been issued by them as issued by Surgeon General as recited in our letter August 23rd. Such instructions will no doubt come forward within a few days and immediate announcement of same will be made.

You will be governed by the Provost Marshal General's letter of September 6, 1918, regarding Amendments to Sections 151 and 157, of the Selective Service Regulations, as follows:

1. In order to relieve a registrant in Great Britain who has attempted to enlist in the army of the United States and has been rejected for military service on account of physical disqualifications from the necessity of physical examination pursuant to Section 142 S. S. R., or from the obligation to return to the United States if an order for his induction has already been issued by his Local Board, the following addition has been made to Section 151 (1) as contained in my letter of August 2 to all Draft Executives, and the note to Section 157 promulgated at the same time has been amended to read as follows:

2. Section 151 S.S.R. is amended by the addition to paragraph (1) of the following:

' If a citizen of the United States in Great Britain, who has registered, applies for enlistment at a Recruiting Station in Great Britain and is rejected for military service on account of physical disqualification, thereafter upon presentation by such registrant to his Local Board of a certificate by the Recruiting Officer stating that the registrant applied for enlistment and was found physically disqualified (as the case may be) for military service, together with a copy of the report of the physician who examined the applicant for enlistment, such certificate and copy of examining physician's report shall be filed with the questionnaire and the registrant shall be placed in Class V on the ground that he is totally physically unfit for military service.'

3. Note 1 to Section 157 is amended to read as follows:

'When a Local Board learns that one of its registrants is in Great Britain or France, it shall, when issuing his induction order (Form 1028) place the date of reporting so far ahead that the registrant will have time to apply for

enlistment voluntarily with the American Expeditionary Forces. After a reasonable time, a Local Board should receive either a certificate indicating that the registrant has so enlisted or a certificate and report of physical examination showing that the registrant has been rejected by the recruiting officer as physically unfit for military service. If such certificate of enlistment or such certificate and report of physical disqualification is not received within a reasonable time, the Local Board shall report the registrant to the Adjutant General of the Army on Form 1018 in the usual manner. If such certificate of enlistment or such certificate and report of physical disqualification is received, the registrant shall be classified in Class V whether or not the date specified in Form 1028 has passed at the time of the receipt of the certificate of enlistment or the certificate and report of physical disqualification."

This office is in receipt of letter dated August 12,  
1918, from the Provost Marshal General as follows:

1. The attention of this office has been drawn to the fact that there are many cases where inducted men enroute to camps have trouble due to improperly prepared transportation requests or meal tickets, or because of their not having been issued a sufficient number of meal tickets to subsist them enroute to the mobilization camp. In response to inquiries as to the proper procedure, the following is directed:

2. A Local Board to whom an inducted man applies for correction of an error in his transportation request or meal tickets, or to obtain a sufficient supply of meal tickets necessary for the number of meals required enroute to mobilization camp, may correct the error or supply the deficiency. Each case must be treated according to the circumstances and care must be taken that the Government is not defrauded thereby. Inducted men should be required to show their induction papers or other evidence that they are traveling to camp and that the deficiency is not caused by any fault of their own. In every case, a report of the circumstances connected with the issuance of requests or meal tickets, must accompany the memorandum copies to the Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C.

3. Where issuance of transportation requests or meal tickets is made to an inducted man who, through his own carelessness, has been left behind while enroute to camp, a full statement of the circumstances should be made and accompany the memorandum copy of the transportation request or meal tickets, forwarded to the Quartermaster General."

3. This office is in receipt of instructions from the Provost Marshal General as follows:

"Reports reaching this office indicate that considerable confusion exists in the matter of the preparation of records covering induction and enlistment. My letter of April 29, 1918 clearly outlines the difference between enlistment and induction.

When a registrant enlists in the Army, Navy or Marine Corps, the Local Board should immediately proceed to reclassify such registrant, placing him in Class 5-D. However, the Local Board should not prepare the forms enumerated in Section 146, Selective Service Regulations, or report such registrant in its daily report of induction. The only concern the Local Board has in such cases is to grant the release, and upon notification of enlistment and acceptance to reclassify the registrant in Class 5-D.

On the other hand registrants inducted into the military service are not to be reclassified in Class 5-D. The classification of a registrant does not change upon induction into the Military service, but the Local Board must record the day and hour the registrant is ordered to report for military duty in column 24 of the Classification List. In cases of rejection or discharge at a mobilization camp of any registrant, the Local Board should immediately reclassify in accordance with the action of the camp authorities."

"The Quartermaster General directs that where meal tickets, (Q. M. C. Form 40, approved by the Comptroller of the Treasury, June 15, 1918) are used for furnishing lodgings where necessary to keep selected men over night before entrainment or to furnish necessary lodgings at junction points en route to mobilization camps, that forms be altered to call for lodgings instead of meals, and that the price be altered according to the necessity in each individual case, not, however, to exceed \$1.50 per man per lodging.

The Quartermaster General calls attention to the fact that numerous meal tickets forwarded to his office for payment are not properly filled out and requests that Local Boards be directed to instruct the men in charge of parties in the proper preparation of these forms in order that there may be no delay in making payment."

Danielson's status is that of a deserter, and his case should be properly investigated. You have not advised us whether his Questionnaire has been received. The Report of Physical Examination came from the Local Board for Division No. 1, of Seattle, and if Danielson is within the jurisdiction of that Board, we would suggest that you request that Board to investigate Danielson's delinquency. If he was willfully delinquent he should be prosecuted as directed in the Provost Marshal General's letter of August 13, 1918. For your convenience and reference, we are enclosing herewith a copy of that letter from the Provost Marshal General.

When the matter has been properly investigated, advise us and we will communicate with the Commanding Officer of the proper mobilization Camp in accordance with the Regulations.

"Number B-3569. Instruct all Local Boards to proceed with the general classification of registrants of the class of September 12, 1918 except that, until they have acquainted themselves with the second edition Selective Service Regulations now being issued and advance copies of which were forwarded September 21st., Local Boards shall defer action in the cases of Board Members and Draft Officials and employees, firemen and policemen, Government employees, recent marriage cases, registrants with non-citizen dependents residing abroad, aliens, legislative, executive and judicial officers and registrants who upon induction into the service receive income from their states or municipalities.
