Again on Sept. 27, 1918, we directed your attention to the necessity of reporting this case on Form 1018.

Since Circular No. 1 was issued, Section 140 of the Selective Service Regulations has been further amended. "If you have not already reported desertion as provided Section 140, including Form 1018, do so immediately."

The second paragraph of Section 140, at the time we wired you, provided that you should report the desertion to the police authorities, and if the police authorities were unable to produce the deserter within 48 hours, you should immediately report the case to the Adjutant General of the Army on Form 1018, enclosing

- (1) A copy of the order of induction into Military Service (Form 1028),
- (2) A copy of the Registration Card (Form 1)
- (3) A copy of the Report of Physical Examination (Form 1010)

Julius R. Lange was listed by your Board on Form 1013 and a delinquent order was issued, but on request of Mr. Fox of your Board the case was deferred pending physical examination which it was expected would be received.

Emil Reinhart Lange was not listed on Form 1013, and, we are informed, it was because your Board had placed him in the Emergency Fleet List.

We have been informed that the registration card of Julius R. Lange shows that he is a declarant, from Norway, and, under the new regulations, not subject to involuntary induction should he desire to renounce his intentions of becoming a citizen. This case should be handled as prescribed in Section 117½ of the Regulations.

We have been informed that the registration card of Emil R. Lange indicates that he is a naturalized citizen. This man should be inducted into the military service if qualified and he is not continued in the employ of the Emergency Fleet.

We have today wired the Department of Justice, Tacoma, in reply to the two telegrams of October 8th, and have requested that Department to have Emil R. Lange physically examined and wire whether he is qualified for military service.

**PREPARATION OF MOBILIZATION PAPERS.**

The Local Boards are, undoubtedly, impressed by the amount of clerical work that is essential in the administration of the Selective Service Law.

Major Fitzpatrick has just visited Camp Grant and gone over with the Personnel Officers at Camp Grant all the processes through which a registrant passes immediately after his arrival at Camp Grant. The personal impression he received was of the very great importance of the Mobilization papers by the Local Board.

It is of the utmost importance that the mobilization papers should be prepared exactly as requested in the Regulations.

It is of the utmost importance that every paper sent with a registrant should bear the stamp of the Local Board.

It is of the utmost importance that the name of the registrant should everywhere be spelled alike and be identical in form.

You can materially assist the Army authorities at Camp Grant and facilitate the progress of the work of mobilizing the Army of the United States by giving the utmost care to the preparation of the mobilization papers and by a very careful rechecking of the papers before they leave your hands.

The requirement that certain papers should be sent by registered mail to the camp affords the only effective means of checking men as to their arrival or not and as to their status.

**JUST A LITTLE MORE CAREFUL ATTENTION TO THE PREPARATION OF THE MOBILIZATION PAPERS WILL BE VERY HELPFUL IN ORGANIZING THE ARMY OF THE UNITED STATES. YOU WILL THUS EARN THE VERY SINCERE GRATITUDE OF ALL THE CAMP AUTHORITIES AND PARTICULARLY THE PERSONNEL OFFICE.**

Having reference to the registration of Indians and half-breeds who live separate and apart from tribes and who were registered in accordance with instructions communicated to you in our letter of July 23, 1918:

Excepting only half-breeds or Indians who became twenty-one years of age during the period between the First Registration and the close of the Second Registration and who were properly included in the Class of June, 1918, you are instructed to include in the Third Registration the Indian and half-breed registrants so registered, instead of incorporating them in the Class of 1917. If any such registrants have been included in supplementary lists Forms 101 and 102 as of the Class of 1917, advise us the names of such registrants, so that cancellation may be effected.

1. This office is in receipt of a letter addressed by John C. Rathbone, Dawson, under date of Sept. 30, 1918, to the Local Board of Eagle, Alaska, accompanied by a letter from Mr. R. E. Steel, the Chairman of that Local Board, recommending that Mr. Rathbone's request that Dr. J.A.R.Glancy be appointed Medical Examiner at Dawson to conduct such physical examinations as may be required of registrants residing in that vicinity.

2. Information is given that you will certify to the registration of such residents of Dawson and vicinity filing registration cards with local boards in the United States.

3. This office is forwarding, for your use, copies of the Selective Service Regulations, Registration Regulations, President's Proclamation, Registration Cards, Third Edition Questionnaires, and other printed matter relating to the registration and classification of registrants by local boards of the United States. In this connection, your attention is invited to Section 56 of the Selective Service Regulations relating to the registration of persons residing abroad, and to Section 142 of the Selective Service Regulations relating to the physical examination of persons residing abroad.

4. The last mentioned section of the Regulations provides that American Consuls shall appoint competent physicians to make the physical examinations of registrants who receive from local boards notices to report for examination, and it is provided that, in each case, four copies of Form 1010 Report of Physical Examination shall be furnished and the Consul shall indorse the appointment of the medical examiner upon the face of three copies of such form.

5. The Standards of Physical Examination now used in the examination of Selective Service registrants are contained in Form 75, copies of which will be furnished to medical examiners appointed by American Consuls to conduct physical examinations of registrants.

6. If there is anything this office can do at any time to assist you or to assist registrants in complying with the requirements of the Selective Service law, you may feel assured of receiving a quick response if you will advise the undersigned concerning what is desired, and the Local Board of Eagle, Alaska, which is the nearest local board in the territory to Dawson, will undoubtedly assist in every way that may be in its power.
