2. On receipt, yesterday, of a letter transmitted by the Local Board of Eagle, Alaska, from Mr. John C. Rathbone, this office addressed a letter to Dr. G. M. Faulkner of Dawson City. For your information, a copy of the letter to Dr. Faulkner is herewith enclosed.

3. There is also being forwarded to you, copies of the Selective Service Regulations and of the Standards of Physical Examination governing the entrance to all branches of the Army of the United States, which will undoubtedly be of service.

6. Also, you will find enclosed two copies of the Roster of Selective Service Officials in the Territory of Alaska.

7. This office will be pleased to hear from you should you desire any information or if you find there is anything that may be done to further the registration of U.S. citizens in Canada or their compliance subsequently with the regulations.

SUBJECT: Revision of Form 75.

1. A revision of the Standards of Physical Examination (Form 75, Provost Marshal General's Office) is in press and will shortly be issued.

2. The changes are few, and are mainly with a view to making available the greater number of registrants having remediable defects (Group B), by transferring them to Group C, for special or limited service. Thus, when inducted and accepted at camps, the defects may be corrected when convenient; meanwhile, the Army will have the benefit of the services of these men.

3. Registrants who have heretofore, upon examination, fallen into Group B (the deferred remediable group) and who now, under the revised Form 75, have physical defects placing them in Group C (as physically qualified for special or limited military service), should at once be reviewed, re-examined if necessary, and recorded in Group C, subject to call for special or limited military service.

4. The next most important change is that which cites certain variations from Army physical standards in the assignment of inducted men to the Navy and the Marine Corps. An extract showing these variations is appended.

5. Attention is called particularly to the Important Prefatory Note, and to Sections 4 and 5.

6. Form 75 pertains only to the Selective Service and will not be issued to the Army. In its stead, the Adjutant General will distribute to all mobilization points a pamphlet known as Special Regulations No. 65, War Department, which is identical with Form 75 as to physical standards.

7. This communication will be immediately promulgated to all concerned in the execution of the Selective Service Law.

8. On receipt of the 2d Edition of Form 75, old copies of the former edition should be at once destroyed, with the exception of such as are needed to complete permanent reference files.

9. Prompt report will be made to this office as to the following matters:

- (a) Receipt and promulgation of this letter.
- (b) Receipt and issue of Form 75, Second Edition.
- (c) Completion of review and regrouping of Group B registrants.

(h) When, if at all, did Board receive its first intimation that registrant was dissatisfied with the action of such Board in inducting him into service.

(i) Whether this request seems to be due to the initiative of registrant, or whether it appears to have been instigated by outside persons and appears to be a part of a scheme to secure wholesale exemption of aliens.

1. The receipt of your telegram of Oct. 19, 1918, No. D448, is acknowledged.

2. A day before the receipt of your telegram, a letter was received by this office, through the Local Board of Eagle, Alaska, from John C. Rathbone, Deputy Registrar at Dawson, regarding the filing of registration cards and subsequent physical examinations of registrants required to report in response to orders from local boards. In accordance with a suggestion contained in Mr. Rathbone's letter this office addressed a letter to Dr. G. M. Faulkner of Dawson.

3. On receipt of your telegram of Oct. 19th, this office addressed a letter to the United States Consul at Prince Rupert, B. C., enclosing a copy of letter of Oct. 18th to Dr. Faulkner of Dawson.

4. This office is of the opinion that the physical examinations of persons residing in Dawson and vicinity can be conducted in the manner prescribed in Section 142 of the Selective Service Regulations. The registration of such persons as reside in Canada can, of course, be accomplished as provided in Section 56. Furthermore, the classification of such registrants can also be accomplished, although it cannot be done as readily as in respect of registrants who reside in the United States.

First: Dental students are not to be regarded as included within the scope of paragraph (c) Section 79, S. S. R., Second Edition.

Second: Imperative military necessity demands a prompt classification of registrants under the delayed Man Power Bill of August 31st, extending age limits upward to forty-five and downward to eighteen. It became necessary to frame and distribute the questionnaire prior to the enactment of that bill. It transpired that the law as passed differed in some more or less important points from the bill as it stood when the questionnaire was framed. The result was that the Selective Service Regulations, Second Edition, being drawn in conformity with the law as passed, differed in some points from the questionnaire, which was based on the bill as it stood when the questionnaire was framed and as it was thought the bill would pass. For example, it will be observed that paragraph (c), Section 79, S. S. R., Second Edition, is in conflict with subdivisions, Class V, of the first page of the questionnaire.

In view of the foregoing, boards should be immediately instructed that paragraph (c), Section 79, S. S. R., Second Edition, is the controlling regulation for the classification of theological or medical students, and not the statement under subdivision C, Class V, of the first page of the questionnaire.



Subject: Application of Section 140 S. S. R., Second Edition, to registrants who have become deserters under calls for Navy or Marine Corps.

1. You will be governed by instructions contained in letter dated October 15, 1918, from the Provost Marshal General, as follows:

"1. By general letter of September 17, 1918, on the subject of "Induction for the Navy and Marine Corps" attention was called to the amendments to the Selective Service Law and Regulations, by virtue of which registrants are to be inducted into the Navy and Marine Corps as well as into the Army. It is assumed that Local Board members have become familiar with the Second Edition of the Selective Service Regulations and the amendments making them applicable to the Navy and Marine Corps.

2. In applying the provisions of Section 140, S. S. R., in cases of desertion under Navy or Marine Corps calls, Local Boards should bear in mind the amendments to the law and Regulation above referred to, and, for some of the terms used in Section 140 relating to Army deserters should substitute the appropriate terms applying to the Navy and Marine Corps, namely:

(a) For the term "army post, camp or station", or "mobilization camp" substitute "naval mobilization camp" or "marine recruiting station", as the case may be.

(b) For the term "Adjutant General of the Army" substitute "Chief of the Bureau of Navigation, Navy Department", or "Major General Commandant, United States Marine Corps", as the case may be.

(c) In reporting the final disposition of the case of a deserter on Forms 1021 A and B, there should be written thereon the words "Army deserter" or "Navy deserter" or "Marine Corps deserter", as the case may be.

3. Paragraph 3635 Navy Regulations provides that:

'A reward not exceeding fifty dollars may be offered by a Commanding Officer for the delivery of a deserter and one not exceeding twenty-five dollars for the delivery of a straggler into the custody of the Naval authorities at such place and within such time as may be prescribed in general or specific instructions issued by the Department (Bureau of Navigation), or, in the case of a marine, by the Commandant of the corps. This reward paid for the delivery of a deserter or straggler, in no case exceeding fifty dollars or twenty-five dollars, respectively, shall be checked against the accounts of such deserter or straggler, and shall be in full satisfaction of all expenses for arresting, keeping and delivering such deserter or straggler other than the expense of telegraphing. In extraordinary cases, where by reason of the distance to be traveled, the amount of such reward will not compensate, transportation may be furnished, upon the order of the Navy Department (Bureau of Navigation) or Commandant of the Marine Corps, as the case may be, to the civil officer from the place of arrest to the place of delivery and the return of such officer, in addition to the reward of fifty dollars or twenty-five dollars, as the case may be.'

Under the foregoing paragraph of the Navy Regulations no reward will be payable for the apprehension and delivery of Navy and Marine Corps deserters until a formal offer of reward has been made by the proper officer. Immediately upon completion of entrainment of a party of inducted men for the Navy or Marine Corps, the Local Board shall report by mail to the Commanding Officer of the naval mobilization camp or marine recruiting station to which such inducted men are entrained, the names of men to whom Form 1028 was mailed and who failed to report for induction and entrainment, stating whether or not, to the knowledge or belief of the Board, such man or men were attempting to evade service. The Commanding Officer of the naval mobilization camp or the marine recruiting station has authority to offer a reward for the apprehension and delivery of such men, as well as for men who deserted after entrainment, (that is, men who were properly entrained and whose names appear on Form 1029 but who

absented themselves from the party en route or otherwise refused or neglected to proceed to the mobilization camp or recruiting station as ordered). A copy of this offer of reward will be mailed to the Local Board, and as above noted, until such offer is made, no reward will be paid, but reimbursement may be obtained for actual expenses incurred.*

1. Induction into Army Officers' Training Schools is accomplished by competent orders under provision Section 158 F.

2. September 16th the Secretary of War issued the following order: "Qualified men between the ages of eighteen and forty-five belonging to the deferred class on grounds other than industry, occupation or other employment, including agriculture, may be inducted into the service and admitted to the Officers' Training Schools with a view to obtaining commissions at the close of the prescribed course, provided that, should they fail to obtain such commissions, they may be given the option of a discharge from the service and reversion to their original classification under the Selective Service Regulations."

3. Complaint from Camp Commanders indicates that many Local Boards are refusing to induct men into Officers' Training Schools unless they are in Class 1, and are requiring registrants in deferred classification on account of dependents, to be reclassified, before induction into Class 1, which procedure denies the right of such registrants to revert to their original classifications if and when discharged from the service and returned to civil life.

4. Procedure complained of is erroneous. Please issue immediate instructions to Local Boards to honor competent orders without altering classification of men inducted. This applies to all such men heretofore inducted, as well as those hereafter inducted, and necessary corrections must be made in all cases, so that in the event of discharge from military service of such registrants they shall be restored to the classes where they belong according to the regulations as applied to the facts of each case, regardless of their having previously been inducted into Officers' Training Schools by means of competent orders.

Commanding Officers of the various schools are being requested to give to such inducted registrants the orders necessary to secure compliance with such request. Each questionnaire, when returned, shall be filed with the record of the registrant returning it, in the usual manner. In this connection, it should

(a) What final classification has been accorded registrant under his questionnaire?

(Ans.) Class I, Division A.

(b) What, if any, claim for exemption did registrant file with his Board? If not, did he understand his right as to claim?

(Ans.) No claim for exemption has been filed by registrant. In his questionnaire he answers under Series VII that he does not claim exemption. On registration card exemption is claimed.

(c) Please furnish a brief account of the steps taken by the Boards in classifying this registrant so far as they bear upon his opportunity to present his claim for exemption on the ground of alienage and to be heard thereon.

(Ans.) The same steps were taken in the classification of this registrant as in the cases of others generally. This registrant was given every opportunity to be heard, but made no objection to entering military service.

(d) If registrant has been inducted into military service then the date on which he was so inducted, the date on which he was sent to his mobilization camp, together with the name of such camp, and the designation of the unit to which he is attached, if such information is available.

(Ans.) So far as this Board is informed, registrant has not yet been inducted, but induction order was telegraphed to Local Board, Butte, Montana.
