2. Your Board certified Clatich on Form 1013, although special regulations apply in respect of alien enemies who fail to file questionnaires. Delinquent notice was mailed to him and subsequently he was listed on Form 1015. However, in reporting him on Form 1015, a special note was made showing that the registrant was an Austrian alien enemy. It is doubtful whether the Adjutant General's Office would enter any alien enemy on the record of deserters. In any event, a net desertion list will have to be furnished, and the name of no such registrant should be shown in that list. If request for discharge were made to the Commanding Officer of Mobilization Camp in any such case, there is no doubt that a discharge would be given.

3. As you know, the case of any wilful delinquent who is an alien or an alien enemy and not liable to draft should be reported by you to the Department of Justice with such recommendation as you see fit to make regarding prosecution.

4. You are requested to carefully observe the Regulations concerning the classification of alien enemies who fail to file questionnaires.

Registrant finally classified V-F. Claimed deferred status on ground of being an alien who had not declared his intention to become a citizen of U. S. Registrant was classified in 1-A upon the belief of board that Russian consul had in various questionnaires, waived registrant's deferred classification, even in face of registrant's claim properly made, and that consul had right to do so. The consul complained to Governor in matter of Ambaloff and at about same time complained in the matter of one Akoloff, registrant herein. Governor advised Board of consul's protest and asked if claim had been properly made by registrant. The claim had been properly made by registrant. Board re-classified Ambaloff, and Akoloff on July 6th, and thereafter all other Russians of similar status, who had been improperly classified.

Registrant has not been inducted. He is still in Class V.

The request will then read, "standard sleeping-car increase" or "Tourist-car increase, transportation to be by a direct usually traveled route." The points between which the standard sleeping-car or tourist sleeping-car travel is to be furnished must be specified in this request".

Line (19), strike out the word "third" and insert in lieu thereof the word "second".

Subparagraph (5) of paragraph (d) of Section 168 is amended as follows:

Line (2), strike out the word "five" and insert in lieu thereof the word "three."

3. Upon their return segregate and note the questionnaires of the classes between eighteen and thirty-six years, inclusive. Action relative to those only will later be demanded, While

classification should not be undertaken, a memorandum of the probable classification might well be made for future reference. Of course, this can be applicable only in cases where the Local Board has original jurisdiction. Those cases demanding action by District Boards should be kept separate for speedy transmission when classification is later ordered. No classification cards should be issued save only in very exceptional circumstances.
