

1. Your Board certified Antonich on Form 1013, although special regulations apply in respect of alien enemies who fail to file questionnaires. Delinquent notice was mailed to him and subsequently he was listed on Form 1018. However, in reporting him thus, a special note was made showing that the registrant was an Austrian alien enemy and it is doubted whether the Adjutant General's Office would enter any alien enemy on the record of deserters. In any event, a net desertion list will have to be furnished, and the name of no such registrant should be shown in that list.

2. If you request the Commanding Officer of Mobilization Camp to issue a Discharge from Draft in any such case, there is no doubt that discharge would be granted.

3. You are requested to carefully observe the Regulations concerning the classification of alien enemies who fail to file questionnaires, and, in the case of any willful delinquent who is an alien or an alien enemy and not subject to draft, you should report the matter to the Department of Justice in order that the registrant may be prosecuted for non-compliance with the Selective Service Law.

1. The following regulation is added as Note 2 to Section 151, second edition of the Selective Service Regulations:

**"INDUCTION OF APPOINTEES TO THE MILITARY AND NAVAL ACADEMIES TO BE DEFERRED."**

"When a registrant, before he has actually been inducted into the military or naval service and regardless of whether or not he has been classified, exhibits to his Local Board a letter addressed to him by the Adjutant General of the Army or by the Bureau of Navigation of the Navy Department to the effect that he has been selected as principal for appointment, or has been conditionally selected as alternate for appointment, or has been designated as an honor graduate of an honor school to compete for appointment, or has been designated by the Governor of a State as an enlisted man of the National Guard for examination, or has been designated by the President as a competitor for appointment, as a cadet in the United States Military Academy, or as a midshipman in the United States Naval Academy, as the case may be, the Local Board shall delay the call and defer the induction into the military or naval service of such registrant until the expiration of a period of ninety days from and after the date specified in such letter of the Adjutant General of the Army or the Bureau of Navigation of the Navy Department as the date of the entrance examinations mentioned in such letter.

"When a registrant whose induction has been deferred as herein provided exhibits to his Local Board, either before or after the expiration of the said period of ninety days and before he has actually been inducted, a notification addressed to him by the Adjutant General of the Army or by the Bureau of Navigation of the Navy Department to the effect that he has passed his mental examinations and shall present himself for physical examination or for entrance to the Military or Naval Academy, as the case may be, the induction of such registrant shall further be delayed for a period of thirty days from and after the date specified in such notification.

"Said delay of call and deferment of induction shall not constitute deferred classification.

"On and after the expiration of said first mentioned period of ninety days the induction of such registrant shall no longer be deferred except in case of the granting of a further delay or deferment for the additional period of thirty days hereinbefore mentioned after the expiration of which second period of thirty days the induction of such registrant shall no longer be deferred.

"Provided that no such registrant shall be involuntarily inducted until his age group and class and order number have been reached in due course after the procedure provided in the Selective Service Regulations.

"Whenever a registrant has been actually appointed as a cadet in the United States Military Academy or as a midshipman in the United States Naval Academy, the Superintendent of the Military or Naval Academy as the case may be, shall notify the registrant's Local Board that the registrant has been so appointed, upon receipt of which notice the Local Board shall place the registrant in Class Five, Division D, as a person in the Military or Naval Service."

You will be governed by the instructions contained in telegram from the Provost Marshal General, dated Nov. 9, 1918, as follows:

**No. D 710**

1. The Military Service Convention with France, providing for compulsory military service of citizens of the United States in France, and of French citizens in the United States, became effective Nov. 8, 1918, when the ratifications thereof were exchanged. Copies of this convention are being mailed to State Headquarters for distribution.

2. It should be especially borne in mind that this is not a draft by France of French citizens in the United States. This convention merely provides that French citizens in the United States between the ages of twenty and forty-four, both inclusive, shall become subject to military service and entitled to exemption and discharge therefrom under the laws of the United States, unless within the prescribed time they voluntarily enlist or enroll in the French army or return to France for military service, or unless within the same period they are granted diplomatic exemption from service in the forces of the United States by the French government.

3. The registration cards of all French citizens who at the time of their registration as stated on each card were between the ages of twenty and forty-four, both inclusive, except the cards of those who have already been inducted into military service, shall upon receipt hereof be removed by the Local Board from the file of registration cards and shall be placed in a separate file. The registration cards shall remain in separate file where they may be available for inspection by any diplomatic or consular representative of the French government until the expiration of the period within which the induction of such registrant is suspended as herein directed. The statement of a registrant on his registration card that he is a citizen of France shall be sufficient evidence of his nationality, unless the Local Board is satisfied that such statement was not true.

4. 4. In order to comply with the terms of the convention, the involuntary induction of every French citizen, whether a declarant or nondeclarant, and whether unclassified or classified, in Class 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5, who at the time of his registration, as stated on his registration card, was between the ages of twenty and forty-four, both inclusive, shall be suspended until and including January 7th, 1919. The involuntary induction of every such registrant who registers after November 8, 1918, shall be suspended for a period of thirty days after the date of registration.

5. Thereafter, every such registrant, unless he has been granted diplomatic exemption by the French government or has enlisted or enrolled in the French army or has returned to France for military service in the French forces, shall become subject to military service and shall be entitled to exemption or discharge therefrom under the laws and regulations in force in the United States in the same manner as a citizen of the United States. No claim for exemption or deferred classification on the ground of alienage shall be entertained or granted in respect of any such registrant. The previous classification of any such registrant in Class V on the ground of alienage shall be cancelled. He shall thereafter for a reasonable time have the right to have his case reopened and to file a claim for deferred classification and proof in support thereof on any ground other than alienage, and he shall be reclassified in the same manner as a citizen of the United States.

6. On request of any registrant or of a French diplomatic or consular representative, Local Boards shall furnish to any registrant who has stated on his registration card that he is a French citizen and who at the time of his registration was between the ages of twenty and forty-four, both inclusive, a certificate in the following form, either in writing or by telegraph:

'It is hereby certified that \_\_\_\_\_ a registrant of this Local Board, stated on his registration card that he is a French citizen.'

The registrant may then enlist in the French army. Thereafter, upon receipt by the registrant's Local Board, prior to the expiration of the time within which the registrant's induction has been stayed, of a notification by a French diplomatic or consular representative in the United States stating that the registrant has been so enlisted, such notification shall be filed with his questionnaire and he shall be placed in Class V-K as provided by Section 79 K, Selective Service Regulations, Second Edition.

7. Upon the receipt by a Local Board of a notification by a French diplomatic or consular representative stating that he, a registrant, is a French citizen, who at the time of his registration was between the ages of twenty and forty-four, both inclusive, and that he is departing from the United

States for the purpose of military service in the French forces in accordance with the provisions of the convention with France, the Local Board shall place the registrant in Class V-K, provided he stated on his registration card that he was a French citizen, and provided further, that the notice was received prior to the expiration of the time within which the registrant's induction has been stayed, and the Local Board shall issue to the registrant a permit under Section 156, Selective Service Regulations, Second Edition, authorizing him to depart from the United States.

8. A declarant or non-declarant French citizen who presents to his Local Board a certificate of exemption from military service in the forces of the United States issued by the French government before the expiration of the period of time in which his involuntary induction has been suspended as herein prescribed shall be classified in Class V-K. Such certificates are issued by the French Ambassador at Washington under the authority of Article III of the convention between the United States and France and may be executed and signed in the name and on behalf of the Ambassador by any French consular representative in the United States. Such certificates may be special or general, temporary or conditional, and may be modified, renewed or revoked in the discretion of the French government. Persons holding such certificates shall, so long as the certificates are in force, remain in Class V and shall not be liable to military service in the forces of the United States."

By direction of the Probost Marshal General, the following message contained in his telegram No. B-4300, has been wired to you in full:

1. All records of all kinds pertaining to the enforcement of the Selective Service law and belonging to Local and District Boards and State Headquarters are public records and as such should be scrupulously kept up and preserved. For the information of the Boards and State Headquarters and in order that they may have in mind their rights and also their great responsibilities in the matter, attention is directed to the following criminal provisions of the statutes of the United States, which provide that:
2. Whoever shall wilfully and unlawfully conceal, remove, mutilate, obliterate, or destroy, or, with intent to conceal, remove, mutilate, obliterate, or destroy, or steal, shall take ~~and carry~~ and carry away any record, proceeding, map, book, paper, document, or other thing, filed or deposited with any clerk or officer of any court of the United States, or in any public office, or with any judicial or public officer of the United States, shall be fined not more than two thousand dollars, or imprisoned not more than three years, or both. Another section provides:
3. Whoever, having the custody of any record, proceeding, map, book, document, paper, or other thing specified in the preceding section, shall wilfully and unlawfully conceal, remove, mutilate, obliterate, falsify, or destroy any such record, proceeding, map, book, document, paper, or thing, shall be fined not more than two thousand dollars, or imprisoned not more than three years, or both; and shall moreover forfeit his office and be forever afterwards disqualified from holding any office under the Government of the United States. Still another statute provides:

4. Whoever wilfully retains any document, writing, or note relating to the national defense and fails to deliver it on demand to the officer or employee of the United States entitled to receive it; or whoever, being entrusted with or having lawful possession or control of any document, writing, or information, relating to the national defense, through gross negligence permits the same to be removed from its proper place of custody or delivered to any one in violation of his trust, or to be lost, stolen, abstracted, or destroyed, shall be punished by a fine of not more than ten thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than two years, or both.

5. The Selective Service Regulations, Sections 11 and 12, lay down rules regarding the confidential character of the records in the hands of the Local and District Boards and of State Headquarters. These regulations must be implicitly observed and followed. No one not authorized thereto by the Regulations or specifically by the Secretary of War shall have access to such records nor shall such records be produced in any proceeding in a court except upon the previous authorization and order of the Secretary of War given to the Board having such records in charge. Instructions will be hereafter given as to the ultimate checking in and accounting for such records.
