1. The account submitted to your board by Deputy Marshal Foreman on War Department Form No. 330 and Department of Justice Form No. 9DC returned herewith. Also enclosed you will find blanks of Form No. 350-A together with a copy of General Orders No. 26 of the War Department.

2. General Orders No. 26 and the Selective Service Regulations cover the procedure quite fully as to cases of desertion.

3. Your board had knowledge as to the time specified for Sanko's induction into the service, as the mobilization papers were received at Cordova. This office has never been informed as to whether Sanko's attempt to evade military service was made before or after the time specified for his induction into the service, nor has information been received as to whether the certificate required on Form 1021 was issued. In addition to the certificate on Form 1021 (if issued), a receipt from the Mobilization Camp showing the delivery of the deserter should accompany the account covering the expenses so incurred, on War Department Form No. 350-A, or Department of Justice Form 5 D.C.

4. Please note that the expenses incurred in connection with the apprehension and delivery of persons prior to the date on which they are inducted into the service are not payable from the Quartermaster Corps funds, but the claim for such expenses should be submitted to the U.S. Marshal with a statement of the facts and a certificate to the effect that the persons apprehended and delivered have not (at the time stated) been inducted into the military service, and in such cases the U.S. Marshal will transmit the papers to the Department of Justice.

5. Please also refer to the Selective Service Regulations -- particularly the pertinent parts of Sections 140 and 80.

This delinquent and deserter list will include persons who should have been reported on Form 1013 or Form 1018, as the case may be, and who through oversight have not been so reported; delinquents in respect of whom you have not received copies of delinquent orders Form 1014 where such delinquents were properly reported on Form 1013; in addition, of course, to delinquents in respect of whom delinquent orders Form 1014 were issued, and the delinquencies either cancelled by this office or reported on Form 1018 where the delinquents failed to report as directed in the delinquent orders, and deserters reported by local boards on Form 1018, by reason of failures of such persons to proceed to mobilization camp as ordered by local boards in orders of induction Form 1026.

2. Your Board will accordingly compile a list of deserters and delinquents, according to Form 1013a (Delinquent Classification List), which is shown in Section 318 (page 270), 2nd Edition Selective Service Regulations, showing the names and last known addresses of such persons, the delinquent order number (if delinquent order issued), order number, date of issuance or mailing of Form 1014, date of issuance of Form 1016 (prior to time specified for induction into military service on Form 1014), date of issuance of Form 1015 (if issued), date of issuance of Form 1017 (if issued), and the date of induction specified in delinquent order Form 1014 (in cases where delinquent orders were issued). A supply of Form 1013a has been sent you, sufficient for your needs. You will please make three copies of your list and forward two copies to this office on Form 1013a.

3. Column 3 of Form 1013a may be used for remarks. These reports will be used to remove charges of desertion standing against registrants, where such registrants were improperly reported, as, for instance, in cases where persons had previously entered the military or naval service of the United States or of the allied countries at war with the enemy of the United States. Therefore, it is important that

your list be carefully checked over and that notations be made opposite each name of any facts which would permit the removal of names from the record of deserters, or, in cases of wilful deserters, that notations be made thereof. You should bear it in mind, in reviewing your delinquent and deserter list, that you may, in your discretion, classify registrants in Class V, where you are satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that such registrants are entitled to such classification, although they have not submitted questionnaires, if they had previously entered the military or naval service of the United States, or they are non-declarants, or enemy aliens.

4. If you are satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that a registrant whose name appears on the list of delinquents and deserters has enlisted in the military or naval service of the United States or of the allied countries at war with the enemy of the United States, a notation thereof should be made, indicating the branch of the service, as, for example, "Enlisted Army," "Enlisted Navy," or "Enlisted Canadian Forces;" or, if so reported and reliable information has not been received, make notations such as, "Reported Enlisted Army," "Reported Enlisted Navy," or "Reported Enlisted Canadian Forces," according to the report received by you. When it is known, or reported, that any registrant listed as a delinquent or deserter, has died or has been incarcerated in an asylum or a penal institution, a notation thereof should be made. When Section 139 of the Selective Service Regulations has been invoked for any reason, a notation "Section 139" should be made, and if a Discharge from Draft has been received in such cases, a notation thereof should also be made. When you previously granted deferred classification in the normal manner without reference to the delinquency, you will please indicate briefly whether authorized by this office by the issuance of Form 1017 or otherwise. Also, in cases where registrants have been inducted into the service without reference to delinquencies or without obtaining the cancellation of delinquent order, you will please indicate briefly the fact with a notation showing the induction call number of the registrant so inducted into the military service. When delinquents have been inducted for delinquency (or discharged) in accordance with amended Section 140 of the Selective Service Regulations (Par. 1, sub-paragraphs "a," "b," "c," "d," "e," "f," "g," or Par. 10), please so indicate, with notation of the date on which your report Form 1021 A & B was made.

2. Many hundred Alaskans, both above and below the previous draft ages (21 to 31), have voluntarily joined the allied colors, and it is to secure a record of them that this plea is mainly made. The names of these inducted through the Selective Service are readily obtainable, and will be contained in another report form about to be forwarded to Local Boards.

3. Each Local Board should assume direction of this work within its jurisdiction and should request some one person to take charge thereof. It is suggested that Commissioners, Marshals, Ministers, Teachers; all religious, fraternal, labor and business organizations, and the press and public be asked to contribute their invaluable assistance and knowledge.

4. It is believed that the following form will suffice:

1. The following telegraphic exchange between the Provost Marshal General's office and this is forwarded for your information and guidance:

**Number 2801.**

1. By my telegram Number 1708 you were requested to discontinue classification and physical examination in the Territory of Alaska.
2. Local Boards will therefore discontinue sending questionnaires to registrants and no further action relating to classification or physical examination shall be taken in respect of any registrant of the first, second or third registrations.
3. District Boards will discontinue all work of classification and of appeals on this date. They will at once proceed to complete all their records in so far as same deficient as to men all classified by them or in respect of whom they have already heard and determined appeals. They will use utmost care in protecting and preserving all records and will await further orders regarding custody and checking in and accounting for their own records. All records belonging permanently to files of Local Boards should be returned immediately to the proper Local Board. Local Boards will forward no more cases to District Boards and no more appeals will be taken now to District Boards.
4. Local Boards will accurately make out and promptly submit as of November 30th the first monthly report called for in recent instructions. Inasmuch as no further cases are to be forwarded to District Boards, for the purpose of the monthly report the classification by the Local Board of cases not so forwarded shall be entered on said monthly report as if they had been finally classified.
5. Immediately upon rendering this report, which must not be later than November 30th, the Local Board records, which are public records of the Federal Government of the United States, shall be sealed by the Chairman of the Local Board by sealing up the cases in which the records are filed and so sealed the records and cases shall be kept sealed and intact subject to further orders from the Governor or the Provost Marshal General.

6. All papers and documents received by Local Boards after the records are so sealed, shall be first clearly and plainly indexed or stamped with the date of the receipt, and then placed in a separate file and held until further orders from the Governor of the Provost Marshal General.

7. Local Boards are further directed as follows: Until further direction no further entries or alterations or additions of any sort or kind or description shall be made in records of any registrant, save under conditions and instructions to be hereafter given by this office. Under no circumstances whatever shall Local Boards withdraw or permit any one else to withdraw any papers whatever now in the Board files or hereafter placed in such files under paragraph 5 above.

8. After the receipt of this order no access shall be given to records of Local Boards on the part of any person whatsoever not a Board member or a member of the clerical force specifically authorized thereto by the Board and no information concerning them shall be given out except upon the written instructions of the Governor or of the Provost Marshal General's Office.

9. A scrupulous observance of the foregoing Rules is essential in order that the records themselves shall not be vitiated and in order that the Local Boards shall be protected against the importunities of registrants and against serious charges to which any other course would lend color and might give substance. The powers of the Local Boards in dealing with this situation may be gathered from recent instructions concerning penalties attached to mutilation, alteration or destruction of records.

10. The proper and just administration of the War Risk Insurance Act and of future pension laws of the country will, in many cases, depend almost exclusively upon data contained in these records which will likewise have a vital relationship to charges of desertion and delinquency involving the honor of thousands of registrants. In addition to the foregoing, it is from these records that the history of this war must in good part be compiled, and from them also must come information of the lost values as to man power in case of any future war. For these reasons it is a matter of the highest patriotic duty on the part of the whole Board from which no Board member can escape, to see to it that these records are kept absolutely true and intact.

The regulations relative to compensation of members of local boards, including physicians, are appended. A perusal of these regulations will make manifest the impossibility of making an attempt here to either amend this voucher or prepare another voucher to cover the payment of the bill either in whole or in part from the funds provided for disbursements on account of Registration & Selection for Military Service.

2. If you will have vouchers submitted in the manner and form prescribed by the Selective Service Regulations properly certified by you and by the clerk of your board the same ~~may~~ then be paid.

3. In closing, it is desired to assure you of the appreciation of the efficient manner in which your Board has performed the work of administering the Selective Service law.

"I am paying Board and lodging for a number of stranded registrants from Marshall who came here for physical examination. What do you advise?"

On the 15th of July you were answered as follows:

"Yours 14th re stranded registrants who came from Marshall for physical examination. Are they men who desire to volunteer? If so advise you advance time for induction and send the men to Ft. Davis. Otherwise, limit expense as much as possible and will take up with Provost Marshal General matter of obtaining reimbursement."

4. In the statements accompanying your present claim there is no explanation made of why these several registrants were detained at Nome from July 8th to August 7th, 1918. It is apparent that some of them were there for a period of thirty days; others for a week or more, and all seemingly within the period mentioned. It is not clear why the directions contained in that portion of the telegram of July 15th as follows: "Are they men who desire to volunteer? If so advise you advance time for induction and send the men to Ft. Davis", were not followed.

5. Your attention is called to the fact that the voucher for the sum of \$20.00 from The Str. Flyer is not properly executed. It is suggested that the same be signed as follows:

"The Str. Flyer,  
By E. L. Erickson, Master and Owner"

a certificate should accompany the same to the effect that the fares charged therein are reasonable and just and not in excess of fares charged to other persons.

6. Upon return of an amplified statement conforming to the suggestions herein contained, this office will gladly recommend the same to the Provost Marshal General for payment and, in the event of failure there, will recommend to the Territorial Legislature the payment thereof.

1. The case of Jussila indicates a misunderstanding on your part regarding the disposition of delinquents and deserters. This office has today advised the Commanding Officer, Fort Seward, that Jussila's delinquency was nonwilful, and he will be discharged.

2. It rests with the Local Board of jurisdiction to determine whether delinquent registrants are wilfully delinquent, and in respect of all wilful deserters who are apprehended and who are qualified for service, the certificate, Form 1031, prescribed by the Regulations, should be issued.

3. Where registrants are in the jurisdiction of other Local Boards either in Alaska or in the States, you should request an investigation in each case by the Local Board (if known), or by the County authorities or by the Department of Justice.

4. This office has forwarded to you the report of physical examination received from the Local Board for the County of Summit, Park City, Utah. That Board failed to take action on the request made for the induction of Barra, and you are advised to ascertain whether his delinquency was wilful.

5. Barra, Cortese and Caspell -- and various other registrants-- who were certified by your Board on Form 1013, have been listed as deserters, and in all cases where the delinquency is found to be non-wilful, action under the provisions of Part VI of the Regulations should be taken to clear the record of desertion and obtain discharge from draft, and in this connection it should be borne in mind that Local Boards have authority to postpone sending to camp any registrants whose cases are receiving consideration.
