1. By direction of the Provost Marshal General, his telegram of December 30th, No. D-909, is communicated textually as follows:

"Par. 1. In order to bring about an early termination of work connected with registration, by direction of the President no person shall be registered after December 31, 1918, and Sections 54, 55, 56, and 59 to 61, inclusive, S.S.R., Second Edition, are hereby rescinded.

"Par. 2. The registration cards of all registrants of Third Registration, that is, those persons registered on or after October 15th, shall be assigned serial numbers as prescribed by Registration Regulations No. 3, if received on or before December 31, 1918. Inasmuch as no drawing has been held in Alaska, no order numbers can be assigned such cards.

"Par. 3. Every registration card received by a Local Board after December 31, 1918, from any source, shall be promptly transmitted to Territorial headquarters with the stamp of the Local Board placed on the reverse thereof and with the following inscription written in red ink across its face:

"Received after December 31, 1918."
 "Territorial headquarters shall put all such registration cards in a separate file by Local Boards and shall take no action with respect to the assignment of serial numbers thereon."

In letter of December 23rd and telegram of December 24th, 1918, this office informed you of the instructions received from the Provost Marshal General, regarding reporting on Form 1018 all registrants who were inducted into military service on Form 1028 and who, by failure to obey such induction orders, have become deserters, and that this office shall be notified by you of the fact that all such deserters have been so reported. The Form 1018 report is required by Section 140 of the Selective Service Regulations.

2. Please note that with Form 1018 there shall be enclosed:
(a) A copy of the order of induction into military service,
(b) Registration Card, and
(c) A copy of the Report of Physical Examination in respect of (each) such person.

Third, all persons who have not attained the age of forty-six years on December 16, 1918, are subject to registration under said Act.

The "authority for shipment" of such records on the bills of lading forms will be filled in by you to show "par. 9-h, Sec. 15, Regulations Form 4000," (for packages weighing in excess of four pounds), shipped by express.

3. The Provost Marshal General directs that the attention of all Local Boards be called to the fact that no instructions have been issued for the shipment to Washington of any records or papers now on file at the headquarters of the boards.

Subject: Regulations governing the disposition of records of District, Local and Medical Advisory Boards.

1. Prior to the distribution of the "Regulations governing the disposition of records of District, Local and Medical Advisory Boards" the following steps will be taken.

2. The Disbursing Officer is hereby authorized and directed to procure immediately the stamps designated below, and forward them to the respective Local Boards by registered mail, demanding return postal receipt.

(a) Three rubber stamps containing the code number of each Local Board and suffixed thereto the letters "A", "B" or "C". There is enclosed herewith a list of code numbers for the respective Local Boards within your jurisdiction. The height of the letters of these stamps shall be 1/4 inch, and the length of the stamp shall be not more than 2 inches.

3. The Local Boards shall be directed to make the following use of these stamps:

(a) In order to provide a permanent method of determining without doubt into which registration the order number of a registrant was assigned, it is necessary to suffix to the code number the letters "A", "B" and "C", as follows:

The letter "A" will be used to designate the registration of June 5, 1917. This registration covers all men between the ages of 21 and 30 years, inclusive, who registered on June 5, 1917, or subsequent to that date and prior to September 12, (Oct. 15) 1918.

The Letter "B" will be used to designate the registration of June 5, 1918. This registration was of men in Alaska who had reached the age of 21 years on or before September 5, 1918, and the order numbers assigned to this group of registrants covers all men who registered on these dates and subsequent thereto, but prior to October 15, 1918.

The letter "C" will be used to designate the registration of September 12, 1918. This registration included all men between the ages of 18 and 45, inclusive, except such registrants as had registered in the registrations of June 5 (July 3 to Sept. 3), 1917, and June 5 (July 3 to Sept. 3), 1918. The "C" numbers assigned under this registration were assigned to men who registered on October 15, 1918, and

on any date subsequent thereto, including such men as should have registered under the first two registrations, but who did not so register until October 15, 1918, or afterwards.

The proper stamp shall be inserted strictly in accordance with the rules laid down above and these rules shall not be confused with the provisions of Sections 34 and 35-1, Selective Service Regulations, second edition. Under no circumstances shall a change be made in the assignment of a registration card from one registration to another registration, even though an error was made by the Local Board in assigning the card to the registration under which the order number was given at the time the order number was assigned. Great care shall be exercised to see that the proper stamp is used and that the respective registrations are designated by the stamp bearing the proper letter as hereinbefore directed.

(b) The appropriate stamp shall be placed on all cover sheets and registration cards. The stamp is to be placed on the cover sheet in the right-hand margin immediately over the space reserved for the name of the registrant (so as to show in the file) and on the back of the registration card in the space immediately above the description of the registrant.

4. Places arrange accordingly, and acknowledge receipt of this letter by wire, using the code word "Stamp". A telegram consisting of the word "Stamp" will advise this office that this communication has been received and that you are proceeding in accordance with the directions contained therein.

Subject: Instructions relative stamping code numbers on each Cover Sheet and original and duplicate registration Cards, designating Local Board and First, Second or Third Registration to which registrants belong.

1. For the purpose of facilitating reference to the records of the 23,000,000 registrants, a filing code arrangement is necessary, and, with this need in view, the Provost Marshal General has directed that a code number shall be stamped on each Cover Sheet and on each original and duplicate Registration Card. The instructions given on this subject are based on the attached letter of December 23, 1918, from the Provost Marshal General.

2. By this mail there is being forwarded to you from this office three rubber stamps, each of which carries a code number with a suffix letter. There is enclosed herewith a list showing the code numbers for the respective Local Boards of the Territory of Alaska, and you are requested to check the rubber stamps received with the code number assigned to your Board, which is underlined in red ink on this list, and telegraph this office acknowledging the receipt of this letter and the stamps by message as follows: "Stamps OK". This office will understand therefrom that you have received this letter and the rubber stamps and have checked and found them correct for your use.

3. It is requested that you will then immediately proceed with the work of placing the proper stamp on the cover sheets and the original and duplicate registration cards of every registrant whose card was received prior to January 1, 1919, and serial and order numbers assigned,

of serial numbers, only, to Alaska registrants of the Class of September 13, (Oct. 15 to Dec. 16), 1918.

4. The Local Board of Anchorage, for example, will place on each cover sheet of registrants of the Class of June 5, (July 2 to Sept. 3), 1917, the stamp reading "50-1-1A"; on each cover sheet of registrants of the Class of June 5, (July 2 to Sept. 3), 1918, the stamp reading "50-1-1B"; and on each cover sheet of registrants of the Class of September 13, (Oct. 15 to Dec. 16), 1918, the stamp reading "50-1-1C". This will be uniformly placed on the cover sheet in the right-hand margin over the name of the registrant at right angles to the main body of the reading matter, so that as the files are placed in the filing cases, the persons who have occasion to find the files of different registrants can simply run through the cover sheets in the filing cases and readily locate the Local Board code number and the name of the registrant.

5. You are requested to see that every precaution is taken to avoid the stamping in an incorrect manner of the code numbers. Please again note that the stamp is to be placed on the cover sheet immediately above the registrant's name and that it will have the same alignment as the registrant's name in the right-hand margin and at right angles to the main body of the reading matter on the cover sheet.

6. The code stamp is to be placed on each original and duplicate registration card at the upper left hand corner of the back of the card immediately above the description of the registrant.

7. If there is a doubt in your mind concerning the directions herein given for the stamping of the code number on the cover sheets and the registration cards please immediately communicate with this office by telegraph, requesting further definite advice as to the correct way in which to affix

the code number on the cover sheets or on the registration cards.
