To this end, the Provost Marshal General directed that a notation should be made opposite each name of any facts which would permit of the removal of such name from the record of deserters, and in letter of November 23, 1918, it was stated that the complete list would be used to enable the removal of charges of desertion standing against registrants who had been improperly reported.

3. 1. Your letter of August 19, 1918, was promptly transmitted by this office to the Local Board of Seward, Alaska, on receipt of same September 3, 1918. The mails have been infrequent between Juneau and Seward since that time, and this office has at different times during the past several months wired to the Local Board of Seward calling attention to the importance of promptly answering your letter, and on two occasions received advice from that Board by wire that reply would be forwarded by first mail. A number of days ago this office received from the clerk of that Board copies of some correspondence not bearing on the inquiries. Thereupon a wire was sent to Dr. J. H. Romig, of the Board of Seward, and telegraphic reply was received from him under date of January 21st, as follows:

Records show Aly Bobaloff arbitrarily classified 1-A by Local Board for failure to file questionnaire and placed on delinquent list; subsequently inducted under order clerk of Board, against protest of registrant to Local Board 5, Portland, by Local Board 6, Seattle. Matter of claim of exemption as alien not an enemy never called to attention Haskins and Romig; also action of Russian Consul, Seattle, or letter Provost Marshal General never referred to members of Board named herein. Am having clerk prepare in duplicate answer to Form F replying to each specific interrogation. It is apparent registrant inducted over his objection, as his delinquency was caused by failure to read, write or understand English language and not wilful. Should be classified as alien, not an enemy; not subject military service. Your cable my first knowledge of action taken. This Board carefully examined cards of those not filing questionnaires and classified all such alien delinquents in Class V-F. Classification this registrant 1-A delinquent, final classification V-D. Full detailed report, copies of all letters and telegrams will be forwarded first mail. Recommend immediate discharge registrant from service. Romig

1. Prior to the sealing of their records it will be impracticable, owing to heavy expenses and delay, to inspect some Alaska Boards, particularly those in the interior of the country, Nos. 9 and 16 to 22, inclusive.

2. An inspection of the Local Boards in southeastern and southwestern Alaska (Nos. 1 to 14, inclusive) is possible. However, it is suggested, for reasons of economy and celerity, that, in places remote from Juneau, such inspection be made by member of a neighboring Board of proved efficiency. It is the belief of this office that not to exceed five Boards will need such review.

3. Interior Boards will not receive Form 4004 prior to April 1st, at which time the winter trails break up. Their records could not be transported in any manner prior to the opening of navigation in June.

4. It is suggested, irrespective of whether inspection be made or not, that all Local Board records upon completion be forwarded direct to this office for final inspection prior to their shipment to Washington or other ultimate disposition.

1. This office is returning herewith one copy of report of status of registrants under the jurisdiction of your Board November 30, 1918, received from Mr. Matheson with letter of December 10, 1918.

2. Relative to the enclosed report this office makes the following comments:

The entries as to Classes II and IV of the class of June, 1917, appear to be correct, in that they check with the information contained in the roster of registrants, which was copied from the Classification List. The figures shown for the Class of June, 1918, also appear to be correct as shown on attached report. Likewise, the total for the Class of June, 1917, is correct.

The classification columns of the roster list, copied from the Classification List of your Board, indicates a total (white and colored) in Class I of 49 instead of 47; and in Class V a total of 37 instead of 36. In Class III the record indicates 4 instead of 5. However, the attached report for November 30th shows one case pending before Local Board and one case pending before the Divisional Exemption Board. With further reference to Class I, the information given in line 5 appears to be incorrect. It is presumed that registrants referred to are J. H. McL. Browne and E. W. Wheatly. These figures should be shown in line 6, which covers deserters not accepted at camp.

The number of limited service men used is none.

It is not clear as to what is meant by the figures shown relative to additional registrations made.

3. Having reference to the last paragraph of Mr. Matheson's letter of December 10, 1918, attention is invited to Paragraph 8 of the Provost Marshal General's letter of November 2nd, which accompanied my letter of November 28, 1918.
