1. Your attention is invited to the following telegram sent out by the Provost Marshal General under date of Jan. 25, 1919:

No. C-972.

Par. 1. It is apparent that the cases of a large number of non-wilful delinquents, as well as of wilful delinquents, will be forwarded to the proper United States Attorney for appropriate action. These cases may be considered such more expeditiously if Local boards will insert a brief memo in the cover sheet of each delinquent stating whether in its opinion the delinquency is wilful or non-wilful. Local Boards and the public are interested in quickly clearing the records of their non-wilful delinquents. It is not contemplated that an exhaustive investigation be made in these cases, and the work of closing up the records of Local Boards must not be retarded.

Par. 2. State Draft Executives are authorized to permit a representative of the Department of Justice to be present at State Headquarters during the final examination of the lists of delinquents and deserters and to allow such representative of the Department of Justice access to the records of such delinquents as he may desire to examine.

Subject: DELINQUENTS.

1. The following telegram is communicated for the information and guidance of all concerned:

Washington, D.C., Feb. 7-8, 1919.

Governor, Juneau, Alaska.

No. B-4788.

After conference with the Department of Justice, the following arrangements have been made for handling delinquents:

Paragraph 1. For the purpose of making reports to United States Attorneys required by Section 7 of Form 4000 ("Regulations Governing the Disposition of Records of District, Local and Medical Advisory Boards") State Draft Executives shall prepare a special form. The form shall be headed "Form 4000-A. Report to United States Attorney, under Section 7 of Form 4000, of Delinquency Registrants of Local Board". The form shall be divided into five columns. The first column shall be headed "Name and Last Known Address of Registrant"; the second column "Order Number"; the third column "Recommendation of Local Board"; the fourth column "Recommendation of State Draft Executive"; and the fifth column "Conclusion of United States Attorney."

Paragraph 2. This form shall be prepared in duplicate by Local Boards, on sheets 8 inches by 10½ inches, the original to be delivered to the United States Attorney (by the State Draft Executive) and the copy to be retained with the records at State Headquarters.

Paragraph 3. Entries shall be made on this form as follows:

The State Draft Executive shall, in accordance with paragraphs "(a)" and "(b)", Section 7, Form 4000, after careful examination of the records relating to each case, enter the name of each actual delinquent, whether wilful or nonwilful, in column 1. He shall also enter in this column the last known address of the registrant, immediately under the name. He shall enter the order number of the

registrant in column 2. He shall enter in column 3 the word 'Wilful' or 'Nonwilful,' as the case may be, in accordance with the Local Board's recommendation required by general telegram C-792 of January 25th, 1919. If the Local Board has not, either definitely or indefinitely, indicated its opinion as to whether the offense was wilful, he shall make the following entry 'No Recommendation.' In column 4 he shall enter the one of the following notations which, after careful consideration of all the facts and circumstances in the case, he believes to be applicable 'Nonwilful' or 'For Investigation.' The entry 'Nonwilful' shall be made when it affirmatively appears that the offense was nonwilful. In other cases, in which it affirmatively appears that the offense was wilful, or in which there is insufficient information upon which to base a positive conclusion, the entry shall be 'For investigation.' The purpose is to eliminate the nonwilful cases and to retain all others for investigation with a view to prosecution.

Paragraph 4. It is desired that the United States Attorney shall enter in column 5, in the same manner, his conclusion as to whether the offense was nonwilful or whether the case should be investigated.

Paragraph 5. The Attorney General has instructed all United States Attorneys to proceed at the proper time to State Draft Headquarters, or to assign an Assistant United States Attorney to that duty, for the purpose of examining the contents of the cover sheets of delinquent registrants. State Draft Executives shall advise the respective United States Attorneys when the records relating to delinquents will be available at State Headquarters for their inspection and consideration. The United States Attorneys will be assisted in coming to their conclusions by the expression of opinion of the Local Boards and of the State Draft Executive. The State Draft Executive, the official or clerk at State Headquarters in charge of the records of delinquents and deserters, and all other persons connected with the enforcement of the Selective Service Law, shall co-operate fully with the United States Attorneys and shall render them every assistance possible to determine expeditiously the proper disposition of the case of each delinquent. The State Draft Executive shall also furnish the United States Attorney such clerical assistance, either in making extracts from the records or for any other purpose, as may be necessary. It is believed to be unnecessary and inadvisable at this time to prepare certified copies of the records for use in evidence. The original records will always be available for preparing such copies later as needed.

Paragraph 6. In many cases it will be advisable that the United States Attorney or his assistant be present at the original examination by the State Draft Executive of the records on their receipt from Local Boards. In this regard the State Draft Executive is authorized to make such arrangements with the United States Attorney as may be deemed advisable. He may also, if the United States Attorney so desires, assist him in determining the proper disposition of the cases of delinquents.

Paragraph 7. Attention is invited to the fact that the records of delinquents and deserters will remain at State Headquarters only a short time and every effort should be made, in co-operation with the United States Attorney, to facilitate the examination of these records and to maintain the high standard of efficiency which has heretofore existed in this organization.

This office will forward the original copies of these reports to the United States Attorneys of the respective judicial divisions of the Territory.
