Subject: Sale of Property.

1. The following letter from the Provost Marshal General is quoted for your information:

"The sale of Government owned property now in possession of the several State Headquarters, District, Local and Medical Advisory Boards in the several States, being the final administrative action that will be required of the Boards, offers a splendid opportunity to each Board to finally demonstrate its efficiency by the amount of money that it is able to realize for return to the United States Treasury from the sale of property. True, the war is over, but the expenses must be paid, and every dollar that can be returned to the United States Treasury by the efforts of State Disbursing Officers and Board members to obtain the highest possible prices in the sale of equipment will help more effectually than would the sale of a Victory Loan, a \$50 note or bond, because the dollar from the sale is a dollar reclaimed and need not be repaid by the Government while the note or loan must be repaid with interest. In order that each State Headquarters and Board shall have full credit for its efforts along this line it is proposed to show in the final financial statement that will be made by the Provost Marshal General, the amount of money expended by or for each headquarters and board for office equipment and the amount realized by each State Headquarters and Board from the sale of the property.

Paragraph C of Section 29, P.M.G.C. Form 4005, provides that the Provost Marshal General shall fix the minimum sale value of Government owned property in the possession of the Boards. In compliance with that paragraph the following schedule of sales values is fixed:

Typewriters \$40.00

Furniture, Office fixtures and Supplies, 50% of the original purchase price paid to the dealer who furnished the goods to the Boards.

Waste Paper, the prevailing price for waste paper in the respective States.

The fixing of these prices by this office should not in any way check or deter individuals charged with the sale of the property in endeavoring to obtain the very highest price possible for property sold. These prices.

should be received by Chairman of Boards and accountable officers as confidential information which should not be disclosed, except as hereinafter provided. The price fixed on the typewriters is considered moderate inasmuch as the list price of these machines is \$100 each and they are all practically new and have had little service.

The necessity for all concerned to familiarize themselves with the requirements of part 5, P. M. G. O. Form 4005, and also of the most scrupulous care in carrying out all of the requirements of this portion of the regulations is urged in order that an accurate accounting for all property may be made to the Provost Marshal General and by the Provost Marshal General. This duty is probably the last administrative action which the Boards will be called upon to perform and it should be a matter of pride with them that it be performed up to a standard 100 per cent efficient."

1. On November 27th, 1918, this office transmitted to all Boards the Provost Marshal General's telegram No. D-801, the third paragraph of which reads as follows:

"District Boards will discontinue all work of classification and of appeals on this date. They will at once proceed to complete all their records in so far as same deficient as to men classified by them or in respect of whom they have already heard and determined appeals. They will use utmost care in protecting and preserving all records and will await further orders regarding custody and checking in and accounting for their own records. All records belonging permanently to files of Local Boards should be returned immediately to the proper Local Board. Local Boards will forward no more cases to District Boards and no more appeals will be taken now to District Boards."

2. Again under date of December 9th, 1918, general instructions were given concerning these records, quoting the Provost Marshal General's telegram No. B-4533, the third paragraph of which is as follows:

"District Boards should already have returned all records belonging permanently to the files of Local Boards. Records so forwarded should include all records pertaining to individual registrants, including correspondence and duplicate registration cards which shall be left in the cases in which they are filed. Where Boards have not cases in which cards can be shipped, they will have made, at least possible cost, strong boxes of suitable sizes in which the cards shall be shipped. In case any such records are still in the hands of District Boards, they shall be forwarded to proper Local Boards at once. cccccc"

2. The procedure outlined by the Provost Marshal General for the arrangement of the registration cards is as follows:

(a) The original registration cards are now filed in sequence of order numbers. It is the purpose of the Adjutant General of the Army to use these cards as an alphabetical index of the cover sheets. Local Boards shall therefore arrange their original registration cards in exact dictionary alphabetical order.

(b) The duplicate registration cards which have been returned to Local Boards by District Boards shall be separated into age classes and arranged in each age class alphabetically by name. There shall be four age classes, namely, 18, 19, 20 and over 20. As the registrations of June 5, 1917, June 5, 1918, and August 24, 1918, fall in the last group, the only registration to be divided is the class of September, 1918, and in this latter group the age of the registrant on the date of registration--namely, September 12, 1918--shall govern, as shown in answer to question 3 on the registration card.

(c) When the two sets of registration cards have been arranged as provided in paragraphs (a) and (b), maintaining the proper arrangement, they shall be securely tied in bundles of 500 and packed tightly in present filing cases *****.

Subject: Reimbursement to registrants for expenses necessarily incurred when reporting for examination and induction.

1. Many times during the past year this office has received requests from numerous registrants who were compelled to pay their own expenses when proceeding from their habitations to the point of examination or entrainment. Nearly all of the requests come from the second, third and fourth judicial divisions.

2. At different times this office, under your direction, has attempted to secure aid for these parties, without result. The following telegraphic exchange will serve as an example. On December 14, 1918, I sent you, at Washington, D. C., the following telegram:

"Commanding Officer Fort Davis wires that twenty draftees have expended thirteen hundred seventeen dollars, some prior and some subsequent to induction, and recommends their reimbursement. In addition, Lemen has privately expended approximately three hundred dollars from personal funds for similar cases. Request you ascertain from Provost if his department can in any manner assist."

to which, on December 28th, the Provost Marshal General answered, as follows:

"Number C-848. Reply your telegram Governor Riggs December 14th. No provision under S. S. R. for reimbursement traveling expenses incurred by registrants reporting to entrainment point designated by their Local Boards of origin. Relief such cases was provided in Section 176, Second Edition, S. S. R., which provides for transfer of induction"

Needless to state, the relief provided by Section 176 was wholly inappli-

able in Alaska.

3. It is practically impossible to give an exact estimate of the amount necessary to reimburse these parties. The Commanding Officer at Fort Davis has submitted a statement in behalf of some of the boys stationed there, which totals \$3036.40. In addition, the Chairman of the Local Board at Nome, Mr. G. J. Lomen, has expended from his personal funds \$300.00. Eight draftees resident in the Koyukuk Region reported for induction early in November at Fort Gibbon, having expended \$453.25. The Seward Board has presented a claim on behalf of certain of their registrants, amounting to \$100.34. Another registrant under the jurisdiction of the Nome Board travelled from Bethel to Nome and returned at an expense of \$140.00. There are numerous similar cases. With the exception of the last cited case, all of the amounts listed above were expended by boys who were actually inducted into the service. In addition thereto, many registrants were compelled to expend large sums of money when ordered to report for physical examination and who were never inducted. The total of the above claims amounts to \$3,029.99.

4. I estimate that the sum of \$5,000.00 would be sufficient to reimburse those only whose proper and just claims have been called to our attention. Undoubtedly there are many cases as fully deserving, yet unknown to this office.

5. May I suggest that these facts be brought to the attention of the Territorial Legislature with the recommendation that relief legislation be enacted, along the lines adopted by the State of Washington and other commonwealths.

1. I am reliably informed that in the closing days of the session Congress passed an Act allowing honorably discharged soldiers to retain their uniforms and that they need not be returned to the Government.

2. Relative to the declarants who desire full citizenship, I will investigate this matter within the next few days and advise.

3. This office knows of no method whereby discharged soldiers can be given work or funds by the Government other than provided in Section 1406 of the Revenue Act approved April 24, 1909, which authorizes the payment of a bonus of \$50.

4. In this connection, however, permit me to bring to your attention the method followed in the State of Washington. The Legislature provided for the appointment of a committee of five, to be named by the Governor, and giving it full power to aid and assist any discharged soldier by money advanced or employment. The sum of \$500,000 was appropriated and turned over to this committee for use in that connection.

5. I have suggested to the Governor and the Alaskan Legislature that a relief measure of the same kind be enacted here. I believe the only reason why such an act will not pass is due to lack of funds.
