

Greater hardship will be imposed if they are discharged at this
season of year at great distance from their homes without means to
provide sustenance or transportation period. Recommend their discharge
be deferred until opening of navigation period. Another registrant
from Koyukuk is supposed to be on trail enroute to this post period.
Advise UNQUOTE period. This office has recommended to Provost Marshal
