miles which was great hardship Period & greater hardship will be imposed
if they are discharged at this season of year at great distance from
their homes without means to provide sustenance or transportation Period
Recommend their discharge be deferred until opening of navigation and
provision made for transportation to their homes when discharged Period
Another registrant from Koyukuk is supposed to be on trail enroute to
this post Period Advise UNQUOTE PERIOD I recommend that these men be
retained in service until next spring or if that cannot be done they be
allowed total transportation and sustenance charges.
